



THE SOUTHERN ALPS AN ECO-DESIRABLE **MOUNTAIN RANGE**

Barre des Écrins, Meije and Mercantour... Names that dreams are made of. And the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur region goes the extra mile to ensure visitors to the Southern Alps enjoy discoveries as dizzy as the summits themselves. Tourism development in the Southern Alps is governed by a profound respect for natural and cultural resources.

France's second most-popular mountain range accounts for 65% of the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur territory but just 15% of its inhabitants. An increasing number of holidaymakers flock there every year, seeking sunshine with cool temperatures, pure air, unpolluted rivers and lakes, and wild, wide-open spaces - a myriad of treasures that have earned the Southern Alps its "Puralpes" tagline. Everything here is geared towards preserving the wonderment of visitors and the quality of life of locals – and that includes taking care of our beloved marmots and chamois....

Designated a French ecological planning pilot area, Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur aims to become Europe's first carbon-neutral region from 2037. "Climate criteria are applied to every budget from 2023: whatever the file and field of expertise, every euro spent by the Regional Council must contribute to the fight against or adaptation to climate change. There's even talk of a 100% green budget", explains the President of the Region Sud. The 2021-2027 Mountain Plan is dedicating 200 million euros to sustainable development.

Virtuous practises begin with slow, carbonfree mobility. Thanks to the ZOU bus and TER regional train networks, the Southern Alps is now easily accessibly at a very friendly price from the train stations and

airports of the South's main cities Nice-Côte d'Azur and Marseille-Provence, as well as Lyon and Paris. Happiness is just a train ride away... And there's even a Paris-Briançon night service. Emphasis is on renewable energy production, with Serre Chevalier 2 already producing a third of its own energy needs. Two regional plans - "5 million trees" and "War on fire" - have also reinforced the protection of our forests.

On the conservation front, the Southern Alps is a genuine benchmark, home to four Regional Nature Reserves - Préalpes d'Azur, Baronnies Provençales, **Verdon** and **Queyras** –, together with Europe's largest geological reserve - the Haute-Provence Geopark - and two National Parks, **Mercantour** and **Écrins**, celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2023. Although preservation and sometimes sanctuarization are necessary, they aren't always enough. We rely on inhabitants and visitors alike to promote the destination's "unexpected places", foster gastronomy based on short, solidarity-based circuits and usher in the agro-ecological transition. A combat of the highest order.




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
WHAT'S NEW IN THE SOUTHERN ALPS?



THE SOUTHERN ALPS, A SPORTING HUB

Home to over 150 summits rising to more than 3,000 metres, **Écrins National Park** is a cradle of mountaineering. 15 sites specially kitted out for beginners are now dedicated to introducing aficionados to very high-altitude climbing techniques.

The Southern Alps is a playground for boulder climbing too, thanks to a fabulous variety of hotspots including the cliffs of Ceüze, Orpierre, the Verdon Canyon and Annot, attracting climbers from the world over.

The Climbing World Championships in Briançon in July is a favourite meeting place. In summer, canyoning fans don a helmet and harness before plunging into the gorges of Cians and Haute-Ubaye.

Whitewater sports are also part of the mountain range's DNA: you'll find canoeing, kayaking, rafting and whitewater swimming opportunities galore there throughout the warmer seasons.

And of course, outdoor sports are all geared around preserving the Southern Alps Natura 2000 sites and respecting sensitive natural areas.

The whitewater stadium in Argentière-La-Bessée is a holder of the "Land of the 2024 Games" label awarded to 2024 Olympic Games training sites.

Appreciated by skippers for its thermal winds, **Serre-Ponçon** lake has been designated an Olympic Games inland water sports centre.

The Olympic flame will be crossing the entire region, stopping off - among other places - at Barcelonnette in Ubaye valley. Swimming, running and cycling are on the menu for participants in the **Embrun Man** very long-distance international triathlon race (XXL Ironman category) held every year on August 15th since 1984, spurred on this year by the Nice Côte d'Azur Ironman finals in 2023

Meanwhile, fans of outdoor running, rugged terrains and magnificent landscapes will be jostling for a place on the podium at the Sky Race, Ultra Trail Salomon, Ultra Trail Côte d'Azur Mercantour and Ultrachampsaur.

On the cycling front, cycle tourers get a chance to conquer the mythical mountain passes of the Tour de France every summer in Ubaye, the Briançon area and Mercantour, thanks to the "mountain passes reserved for cyclists" operation. The Southern Alps is also France's leading area for mountain bike touring. with several French Cycling Federation-approved Grandes Traversées long-distance routes including Alpes-Provence, the Transverdon and Les Chemins du Soleil.

The Southern Alps' exceptional aerological conditions attract many aerial sports fans and the area is home to over a hundred launch and landing sites. What's more, Gap-Tallard is Europe's largest skydiving centre

THE SOUTHERN ALPS, A LAND OF ADVENTURE AND ENCOUNTERS

2023 is commemorating the 50th anniversary of Écrins National Park, France's largest national park. Designated an Alpine Protected Area by the European Council, its "Mountaineering Villages" are designed to protect the values associated with this ancient discipline: self-transcendence, mutual aid and respect for the environment.

The anniversary celebrations will be paced with a series of friendly scientific encounters. Head over to one of the seven Maisons du Parc centres to take part in the fun, including field trips, coffee-aperitifs, talks and the traditional Musique en Ecrins music festival, lighting up Vallouise-Pelvoux once again this year.

The rocky faces of the Southern Alps are dotted with numerous fortifications. Under the reign of Louis XIV, Vauban built or restored 12 strongholds stretching from Antibes to Briançon. Now listed as UNESCO World Heritage Sites, the Vauban Fortifications are still very much in the news. The fortified village of Mont-Dauphin is welcoming the "Little Big Horn" show by sculptor Ousmane Sow, Fort de Seyne-les-**Alpes** is setting the scene for an exciting **escape** game and a multimedia show in the guardroom of Fort Vauban in Colmars-les-Alpes will be telling the compelling **Story of Vauban**. Set on the border of the Kingdom of France and House of Savoy, the town's history remained turbulent until 1860. Sébastien Le Prestre, the Marquis of Vauban, also bequeathed a perfectly-preserved military legacy to Entrevaux, now a member of the "Towns & Villages of Character" network. A "Land of Art & History" label is also in the pipeline for the Alpes Provence Verdon metropolitan area.

From the major engineering works of the *Chemins* **8** de Fer de Provence railway to the humble old ovens, fountains and sundials found in the surrounding villages, historic gems are plentiful here. The Southern Alps is a treasure trove of Romanesque and Lombardy art, from Embrun cathedral to modest chapels, often adorned with frescoes painted by Piedmont artists. Many provide a beautiful stage for summer concerts.



The festivals of the Southern Alps give pride of place to sustainability: Potes de Marmot's in Guillestre is a children's festival that aims to raise awareness and protect our marmots. The **Festival Terre Sauvage** in Clarée valley in early July is a meeting place for people committed to cherishing planet Earth. The Festival de Chaillol, taking place in the villages of Champsaur-Valgaudemar, is an ode to music and scenic discoveries. Agropastoralism has carved these landscapes for centuries, scoring sheep tracks across the alpine pastures. It was even listed as UNESCO Intangible Heritage in 2020... In Val d'Allos, you can enjoy a hike with the local shepherds, or ascend to the mountain pastures with the flocks in **Castellane**. A true delight, combined with a meaningful cultural experience.

Relax, reconnect with nature and get your fill of pure air and Vitamin D... With a whopping 300 days of sunshine a year, the Southern Alps is a temple of active wellbeing. Thousands of kilometres of trails - sometimes flat invite visitors to get outside and enjoy a hike.

Walking is the very best way to keep your joints, muscles, tendons and cardiorespiratory system in tip-top condition. Some trails, like the ones you'll find in Valberg, are dotted with contemplative stop-offs, ideal for practising your favourite yoga poses.

The local forests include such jewels as Boscodon, one of Europe's oldest beech forests and now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. So how about treating yourself to a forest bath? Whether your preference goes to pine or larch, a spot of tree hugging never fails to revitalize.

Pure, life-giving water abounds in the mountains of the Southern Alps, bubbling up in the shape of thermal baths at the Grands Bains de Monêtier in Serre Chevalier, Berthemont at the gateway to Mercantour National Park and **Digne-les-Bains**. Elegant balneotherapy centres such as **Durancia** in **Montgenèvre** invite you to let your troubles float away between swan necks, geysers and invigorating water jets, as you gaze out over the glorious peaks. Alternatively, lie back and relax in water heated to 38°C at O'dycea in Dévoluy, as you contemplate the constellations above. The outdoor Nordic bath offers stunning panoramic vistas over Bure plateau too. Or slip into the delicious Aquatic and Balneotherapy spaces on offer at the Vesubia Mountain Park, before heading to your cabin in the pine trees to listen to the sounds of birds... And wolves at the neighbouring Parc Alpha!

The Southern Alps' recent hotels are often adorned with a spa, where you can enjoy a little pampering in expert hands with organic cosmetics made with local plants, including **lavender** and **edelweiss**. You'll find more and more flowers and plants on your plate too, alongside succulent seasonal fruit and vegetables.

The Southern Alps is home to France's **highest percentage of organic farmland**: good news for foodies, hikers, birds and indeed all our planet's inhabitants.

Interestingly, the most recent scientific studies – e.g. the Senckenberg Research Institute's climate studies – show that the higher the biodiversity, the better we feel.

Luckily, Mercantour National Park boasts France's highest floral diversity, while the Queyras area is home to part of the Franco-Italian Mont Viso biosphere – a UNESCO label certifying that mankind and nature live in harmony there.

RETROUVANCE BUËCH DEVOLUY: ON THE ROAD TO OUR FORGOTTEN VILLAGES

♥ LARAGNE-MONTÉGLIN

Enjoy a 6-day hike in the Pays de Buëch area, stopping off at four abandoned villages... This *Retrouvance* (a French National Forestry Commission brand) holiday experience won the Challenge 2023 prize at the French *Territoires Insoupçonnés* (Unexpected Places) competition. The groups of 5 people minimum, which can comprise individual participants, areled by a mountain guideand coordinator, with accommodation at a beautifully restored forester's house in one of the villages. Nestling between the Southern Alps and Provence, on the border of the Drôme, the Buëch area is swathed in alpine lakes, forests, pastures and torrents... The Retrouvance break – an immersive, back-to-nature experience – is marketed by Ahimsa-Voyages.

CHAMPSAUR VALGAUDEMAR DÉVOLUY

> The town of **Gap** – the administrative capital of the Hautes-Alpes area - is steeped in the atmosphere of the Southern Alps. Along the ancient Napoleon road, the bluish horizons of Provence give way to breathtaking scenery and Europe's highest bocage adds an extra green touch to Champsaur valley. Valgaudemar, on the other side of the valley's emblematic Chaillol mount, is France's most Himalayan valley, while Pic de Bure, the region's largest astronomical observatory, gazes out over the striking mineral formations of the **Massif du Dévoluy**.

Perched at an altitude of 1,950 metres, amid slopes crossing the tiny hamlet of Forest des Estaris, *Le Kitz* was formerly a shelter for shepherds come to make sheep's milk cheese in days gone by. Its 4 bedrooms and 3 bathrooms, with sweeping views over the ski resort and Champsaur valley, can welcome up to 10 guests.

Health professionals with a holistic outlook, Frédérique and Daniel Walser are the brains behind this "energetic hub", ideal for recharging your batteries. The site comprises a deconstructed villa, with four LumiPods scattered throughout 2,500 m² of meadows, above Gap. Offering 180° vistas over the valley and peaks of the Hautes-Alpes – Le Brec de Chambeyron and Le Viso –, each glass and wood bubble measures 15 to 43 m²: one contains a living room and kitchen, two feature a bedroom and bathroom and the fifth houses a spa. The "villa" as a whole can be rented out and comes with the joys of a heated swimming lane. An aperitif is included in each rental, for two nights minimum.

GUILLAUMETTE DRY GENEPI

SAINT-JEAN-SAINT-NICOLAS

The talent behind a distinguished genepi liqueur, winner of the Excellence prize at the 2021 *Concours Agricole*, Maison Guillaumette now produces a dry genepi with half the usual sugar content, applauded by restauranteurs and mixologists alike.

The distillery, located at Pont-aux-Fossés in the town of Saint-Jean-Saint-Nicolas, at the gateway to Écrins National Park, is open to the public mornings and afternoons.

WELCOME TO THE FARM!

SAINT-LAURENT-DU-CROS

The Hautes-Alpes is one of France's most-organic areas, with a whopping 500 or so farms committed to organic production, many of which welcome visitors. Fancy savouring some high-alpine lamb, apples or cheeses?

A few addresses: the Ebrard cheese dairy in Chabottes - where you'll find the coveted *Crémeux des Ecrins* cheese and whipped fromage blanc with blueberries - is celebrating its 120th birthday. *Salaisons du Champsaur* is a charcuterie specialist, whose secrets have been handed down from father to daughter since 1987. Different but just as tempting: two husband-and-wife farmer teams have converted an old sheepfold in the hamlet of Matherons, in the ski resort of Ancelle, where they now offer a range of organic farm produce (eggs, potatoes, etc.) grown on mounds at an altitude of 1,300 metres. You'll find jams, pestos and aperitif nibbles at Les Soldanelles, plus two rural gites, introductions to permaculture and hikes with the house donkeys....

GASTRONOMY -

CHALET NAÏSKA

• LA JOUE DU LOUP

Perched at an altitude of 1950 metres, at the arrival of the Les Fontettes telemix (open in summer), this wooden chalet boasts an exceptional location above Joue du Loup and facing the draped slopes of the Dévoluy mountain chain. Audrey Bouteiller, Benoît, and their dog Chukka, now the chalet's mascot, took over the reins of this high-flying establishment in September 2022. The fare is simple and family-style, with freshly-tossed pancakes savoured on wooden tables. You can spend a night there too if you book ahead – the pretty wood-clad rooms bedecked with felt curtains open onto the picturesque surrounding scenery. You can travel up on a snow groomer on certain dates in winter, to feast on a fondue before spending a night a little closer to the stars.

Snow groomer ride, fondue and night: €480 for two guests. €199 per night in winter, from €159 in summer.

KNOW-HOW


DES CIMES ET DES RACINES

• LE DÉVOLUY

Country-born herbalist Luc Bernard has been exploring the rocky scree and ridges of the Dévoluy mountain chain for nearly 40 years, collecting sea buckthorn and larch flowers and growing edelweiss and genepi at high altitudes. You'll find the syrups, herbal teas and creams he makes with the fruit of the land at his farm *L'Herbier du Dévoluy*. His encounter with yoga teacher Maryline Schied prompted him to build a cabin complete with a meditation platform, tucked away among the spruces and larches of Bois Rond forest. You can climb up there to enjoy a Tibetan Singing Bowl sound bath while contemplating the peaks of Pic de Bure and mount Arrouze. The session ends with a cup of herbal tea or soup cooked over a wood fire. Pure magic.

High-level athlete Yann Debayle, a member of the French biathlon team until 2007, created *Biathlon Evolution* in the aim of offering training amenities and encouraging sports fans of all levels to give it a go. He has now partnered up with Frédéric Jean, also a biathlete and former coach for the French women's biathlon team: "The idea is to develop biathlon and introduce children, teenagers and adults from in and around the Hautes-Alpes to the discipline. We offer four laser rifles, five air rifles and three 22 long rifles for the 50-metre event". The two athletes offer training sessions in Pelleautier, a few kilometres from Gap, or on Gap-Bayard plateau at an altitude of 1,246 metres.

MOUNTAINEERING SCHOOL SITES

PARC NATIONAL DES ÉCRINS

Mountaineering is an art! And to learn it, opt for one of the 15 mountaineering school sites located near the Écrins' *Villages d'Alpinisme* mountaineering villages. The mountaineering school site concept is "one of a kind in France", in the words of Jean-René Minelli, a member of the *Compagnie des Guides Oisans Écrins* guide association. Its members have kitted out natural boulders, climbing routes and waterfalls for beginners at sites located adjacent to seven mountaineering villages. Examples include the Pic des Aupillous ridge (Vallouise-Pelvoux), Pantalon site (Le Monêtier-les-Bains), Fréaux ridge and Balmes boulders (La Grave), plus the route leading from Sirac to La Chapelle-en-Valgaudemar.

These committed initiatives are set to encourage younger generations to discover the beauty and values of mountaineering. The project is led by the Hautes-Alpes Agency for Economic and Tourism Development in partnership with Écrins National Park, and backed by European funding.

ÉCRINS NATIONAL PARK 50TH ANNIVERSARY

PNR LES ECRINS

In 2023, Écrins National Park is celebrating the 50th anniversary of its official opening on March 27th, 1973. In fact, the park was born much earlier: its current core is that of the old Bérarde national park, created in 1913. 110 years ago, its aim was to protect the mountain from the impact of excessive grazing. In 1923, it was renamed Pelvoux national park and covered 32,000 acres. In 1960, France finally began creating national parks as genuine tools for the "conservation of fauna, flora, soil, subsoil, atmosphere, waters and the natural environment in general".

When the Parc National des Écrins – France's 5th national park – was set up in 1973, it had already been a conservation test site for 80 years. Now spanning 227,000 acres between the towns of Gap, Briançon and Grenoble, Écrins National Park has always been a scientific hub. Friendly scientific meetings are scheduled throughout the area for the park's 50th anniversary celebrations, with researchers and residents alike meeting up for a series of café-aperitifs, talks and field trips. June marks the peak of this year's events programme.

A call for projects has also been launched in the aim of creating public events at sites throughout the park.


























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
