#### **CELEBRATE**

We're celebrating lots of anniversaries in 2023, first and foremost the 150th birthday of **Nice Carnival**, followed by the 50th anniversary of the death of **Picasso** on April 8th. This tireless explorer of 20th century art set up home in Provence and on the Côte d'Azur. In 1973, **Chagall**, another "genius of happiness", inaugurated his museum in Nice. 50 years ago too, **Écrins National Park** was made official. Ten years later, in 1963, **Port-Cros National Park** – the world's first marine park – was born.

Sixty is also the venerable age of the **Musée Matisse** in Nice. And in 2023, the **Villa Noailles** in Hyères is celebrating 100 years of eternal youth...

#### **IMAGINE**

The region continues to attract creators and lovers of all things beautiful. The 2023 season will be heralding the inauguration of the Fondation Niel on Giens peninsula and Fondation Hartung Bergman installations in Antibes. The Fondation Maeght in Saint-Paul-de-Vence - the most famous of them all - is reopening in July. Our public museums are joining in the party too, with a breathtaking facelift for the Musée d'Histoire et d'Art in Bormes-les-Mimosas, and refurbishment and extension of the magnificent palace harbouring the Musée des Beaux-Arts in Draguignan.

Stretching from Arles to Menton, the **Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur Modern & Contemporary Art Route** encompasses 63 collections and remarkable venues at the heart of always-astonishing sites.

#### **WELCOME**

From Hameau des Pesquiers in Hyères-les-Palmiers to the Villa Puebla in Barcelonnette, in the Southern Alps, the region's new hotels and guest houses offer the combined pleasures of comfort and eco-friendliness.

The Croisette in Cannes is going greener too, with icons such as the Carlton, Martinez, Majestic and new Mondrian bedecked with gardens that promise to instil the town with a breath of fresh air. Testifying to this resolute eco-commitment, **Green Key** certifications have risen by 40%. What's more, the region is the proud home of France's first "carbon-neutral" beaches.

#### **ENCOURAGE**

Around fifty official Games Preparation Centres are gearing up to welcome athletes prepping for the **2024 Olympic Games**, with an Olympic sailing test event scheduled in the Bay of Marseille in early July. In September, skippers will be training for the 2024 America's Cup off the coast of Saint-Tropez. Meanwhile, Nice - the traditional venue for the Ironman France triathlon challenge every June will be hosting the final of the men's Ironman World **Championship** in September for the first time in 40 years. In September too, Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur will be welcoming the **Rugby World Cup** France 2023, in parallel with the first ever World **Amateur Rugby Festival.** 



#### **EXPERIMENT**

Designated an "ecological planning pilot area", the region is experimenting with a plethora of new, virtuous practises that are set to make both visitors and local inhabitants happy. Respecting natural areas sometimes means limiting the number of people who visit them and shining a spotlight on "unexpected places". It means encouraging solidarity-based gastronomy that uses short circuits, promoting company and artisan tours, and planting the seeds of the agro-ecological transition. Born in 1823, famous naturalist Jean-Henri Fabre's passion lives on at his garden Harmas, now reopened to the public: "Everything ends so that everything can begin again, everything dies so that everything can live". Brad Pitt echoes his sentiment two centuries later: "In nature, anything that is left over becomes food for something else". 3 The actor is intent on rediscovering "nature's original, waste-free beauty".

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

# HAPPINESS IS SUSTAINABLE!

Designated an "ecological planning pilot area" by the French government in November 2022, Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur aims to becomes France's leading region for sustainable tourism. "We're inventing another kind of tourism here, one that preserves our natural setting without deteriorating the sector's economic and social weight."

#### "RESERVES THAT PRESERVE"

Nearly 60% of the region comprises protected natural areas. Our **4 national parks**, **9 regional nature reserves** and numerous other protected spaces pride in welcoming the public whilst preserving the environment

In summer 2022, the **Calanques Marseille-Cassis National Park** piloted an online booking system for *Calanque de Sugiton* and *Calanque des Pierres Tombées* fjords. This measure is intended to limit the number of people authorized to visit the park daily to 400 – versus up to 2,500 previously –, hence considerably reducing pressures on the natural environment. The initiative is extended to 2023.

Meanwhile, two measures have been put in place at **Port-Cros National Park** to channel the number of visitors to the lles d'Or Golden Islands:

- A maximum quota of 6,000 daily visitors on **Porquerolles Island.**
- A Mooring and Small Craft Zone (ZMEL) on **Port Cros island**. Anchorage is now prohibited throughout the year to preserve Posidonia, a pillar of the coastal ecosystem. 68 mooring buoys with eco-friendly anchors, reserved for boats measuring 15 metres maximum, are now available to the public from mid-April to mid-October.

A new way of getting around with Waze: the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur Regional Tourist Board and world's GPS navigation leader, Waze, signed a collaboration in late 2019 – the first of its kind. The principle is simple: Waze app users receive regular notifications on the number of visitors at their chosen site and are directed to an alternative if numbers exceed the limit

#### "WE WANT TO ENCOURAGE PEOPLE TO EXPLORE NEW PLACES"

#### PARK DISCOVERY TRAILS

More and more people are getting back in touch with nature and seeking out the silence and tranquillity of wide-open spaces. And that's a good thing: home to 13 national and regional parks and reserves, the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur region offers a host of discovery trails, encouraging visitors to explore the region "sustainably" on foot, by boat, on horseback or on the water

What's more, these alternative itineraries prompt people to explore lesser-known sites versus the region's "classics". So, instead of heading to the calangues fjords at the height of summer, why not explore the Marseille Canal or Parc Pastré instead? Rather than jostling for space on the Route des Crêtes overlooking the Verdon Canyon, set out to roam the Artuby river. And opt for the peaks of Cheiron in Gréolières instead of the busy Lauzanier valley in Mercantour National Park...

#### **UNEXPECTED PLACES**

Every year, the "Challenge des Territoires Insoupçonnés" (Unexpected Places Challenge) hosted by ADN Tourisme shines a spotlight on the region's little-known treasures. The Pays du Buëch area won first prize in January 2023 with its Retrouvance travel experience, inviting visitors to rediscover four abandoned villages in Buëch valley, nestling between the Alps and Provence. The six-day hike includes accommodation in restored forester's houses. Opening the door to new discoveries and encounters, this award-winning concept holiday has a limited carbon footprint and is accessible by train.

Awarded the title of "Winter Resort Town of the Riviera" by the UNESCO in 2021, Nice is a fitting reminder that the Côte d'Azur is a place to savour throughout the year. Winter offers visitors a unique opportunity to ski in the mountains during the day and dine under blooming mimosa trees by the Med in the evening... After all, Queen Victoria would never have entertained the bizarre idea of visiting the coast in summer! November to April is the ideal time to visit the Côte d'Azur, with the promise of a temperate climate and lots of great events, topped with tranquillity and quiet roads...

#### "ECO-FRIENDLY INITIATIVES GALORE"

Whether they're located in the mountains or by the sea, the region's travel pros, hotels, golf courses and vineyards are resolutely committed to responsible tourism. Inspiring initiatives and projects abound.

#### IN THE MOUNTAINS: CARBON NEUTRALITY

The "2030 Ski Resorts Contract" project aims to replace classic snow groomers with electric or battery-powered groomers and finance wind turbines and various non-ski activities. This project allocates 100 million euros to the region's ski areas in the aim of achieving carbon neutrality by 2030, in keeping with the region's "Let's stay a COP ahead" climate plan.

The first renewable energy laboratory located in the mountains, Serre Chevalier ski resort now produces 30% of its own electricity requirements using renewable energy, without any major impact on the landscape or resources. It is the first ski resort and first ski area in the world to simultaneously use three production technologies: hydroelectricity, solar power and micro wind turbines, providing immediate and adapted on-site consumption.

#### BY THE SEA: PROTECTED MARINE ECOSYSTEMS


**Neptune blue trails.** This international project promotes sustainable scuba diving by raising public awareness on the importance of marine ecosystem protection. The project brings together three Italian regions - Liguria, Tuscany and Sardinia -, together with Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur. Five pilot sites will be welcoming Neptune blue trails: the Cosquer Méditerranée centre in Marseille, Pradeau Fort in Hyères, Balaguier Fort in La Seyne-sur-Mer, the Nice Watersports Centre and Nautical and Underwater Hub in La Londe-les-Maures.

A carbon-neutral beach. Baia Bella in Beaulieu is France's first carbon-neutral beach (according to Allcot). Solar panels, wood furniture and recycled water combine with seabed cleaning and active participation by staff and customers. The beach is also a holder of the Green Key label. N.B. The region is home to France's only two "Green Key" beaches (the second is the Radisson Blu Nice)

# HOTEL-RESTAURANT SECTOR: RECORD PROGRESSION FOR THE GREEN KEY LABEL

Home to 149 new Green Key establishments, Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur has clocked up an impressive 40% rise in holders of the coveted label—the biggest progression in France. This environmental commitment is favoured by partnerships with the Région Sud Regional Council, Marseille Tourist Office & Convention Bureau, Provence Tourisme and the Nice Côte d'Azur Metropolitan Tourist Office. Green Key is the first international sustainable tourism label created for tourist accommodation and restaurants.

# COMPANY & ARTISAN TOURS: HANDING DOWN KNOW-HOW

Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur is France's leading region for company & artisan tours, many with an ecological focus. Visitors keen to glean a better understanding of the new energy landscape can visit EveRé, France's first Integrated Waste Treatment Centre in Fos-sur-Mer, or Alcyon in Bollène Alcyon, which transforms agri-food industry green waste into compost.

Alternatively, the *Compagnie Nationale du Rhône*, located at an historic site in Bollène, offers visitors a fascinating insight into electricity production. And those are just three examples among the many suggestions you'll find on the "Map 100% Made in Sud"! provence-alpes-cotedazur.com

#### ON OUR GREENS: ECOLOGICAL TRANSITION IN FULL SWING

Numerous golf courses are taking an active part in the ecological transition. After six years of work, Mandelieu's Old Course is now irrigated with recycled wastewater – a challenge achieved thanks to the ultrafiltration membranes for fine plastic particles at the Aquaviva plant, one of the best performers on the national scale. The watering system will be in place in June 2023.

The Golf de Frégate Provence golf club in the Var area is celebrating its 30th anniversary with an arbutus, evergreen oak and olive replanting programme. These species are best adapted to our climate and require little irrigation, hence fostering 30% to 50% water savings.

Both courses are part of the Golf Route and Provence Côte d'Azur Golf Pass, offering discounts of up to 25%. www.laroutedesgolfs.com



# IN OUR VINES: PLANTING THE SEEDS OF THE AGRO-ECOLOGICAL TRANSITION

Provence is the first winegrowing region in France to benefit from the national recovery plan, aimed at accelerating agro-ecological transition through the EnViProv programme. The budget – over €700,000 – is 50% funded by the State, via FranceAgriMer. A study aimed at analysing and improving biomass and soils, together with an analysis of the vine's life cycle and vineyard survey assessing the environmental impact of various activities, are ongoing.

#### LVMH, LEADING THE WAY

Bought up by LVMH in May 2019, Domaine Galoupet, between Hyères and La Londe-les-Maures in the Var area, aims to become an environmental benchmark Its 171 acres of vines border 190 acres of protected woodland overlooking the Golden Islands. Director Mathieu Meyer sums it up nicely: "Exceptional wines are the reflection of a living terroir". Today, the role and responsibility of large groups is to explore all avenues of improvement - in this case ranging from organic conversion to planting grass between the vines, agroforestry and irrigation management. Packaging is under the microscope too and it's no surprise: it represents 40% of the estate's carbon emissions. In 2022, Château Galoupet's Galoupet Nomade AOP Côtes de Provence wine was adorned with a plastic bottle created via the POP (Prevented Ocean Plastic) programme, made with 100% recycled materials and weighing 87% less than glass. Interestingly too, the bottle - priced at €25 - is flat to facilitate transport. It has received resoundingly positive feedback from the estate's Nordic customers. "It's a good way to test mental barriers", notes Mathieu Meyer, who is currently developing a new bottle that is both attractive and eco-friendly. Part of the Moët-Hennessy group, Domaine Galoupet has set its sights on becoming a flagship of sustainable development.

# 2023, THE YEAR OF RUGBY

#### **PRO RUGBY EVENTS**

**The Rugby World Cup France 2023**, taking place from September 8th to October 28th, promises to be the year's highlight.

Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur is the **top host region**, welcoming 10 out of 48 matches scheduled in **two host cities: Marseille** (6 matches including 2 quarter finals) and **Nice** (4 matches). Over half a million spectators from 175 countries are awaited in the stadiums of Marseille (67,000 seats) and Nice (35,000 seats).

Supporters will be able to follow their favourite team's training sessions from late August, at the region's various base camps: **Scotland** in Nice, **Uruguay** in Avignon and South Africa's **Springboks**, the outgoing world champions, in Toulon.

Home to the **Rugby Club Toulonnais** (RCT) and legendary **Stade Mayol** stadium, the city of Toulon is the holy land of rugby in Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur. Born in 1908, the RCT boasts a long and glorious history, including three Rugy Europe Championship titles, in 2013, 2014 and 2015. The Rugby Club Toulonnais is also famed for its "war cry" – the inimitable *Pilou-Pilou* chanted by supporters, now the team's hymn.

The William Webb Ellis trophy, which will be awarded to the winner of the Rugby World Cup France 2023, bears the name of an English reverend (1806-1872), presented as "the founding father of modern rugby".

In 1823, Ellis, then a pupil at Rugby school, is said to have taken the ball in hand during a mob football match, thereby defying the game's basic rules, before running to the opponent's goal. His name, which is engraved on the trophy, is a genuine legend in the rugby world. He died unknown in 1872 and now rests in Menton, about thirty kilometres from Nice. His grave, in the Vieux Château cemetery, is signposted. A definite must-do – and the panoramic view over the Mediterranean is to die for...

#### **AMATEUR RUGBY**

Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur will be hosting the **1st World Amateur Rugby Festival** from September 22nd to 30th, bringing together 20 clubs representing the world's top 20 rugby nations, during and under the patronage of the Rugby World Cup France 2023.

Jeremy Teyssier, President of the Digne-les-Bains Rugby Club, is the man behind this ambitious initiative, in partnership with the Fédération Française de Rugby, Ligue Sud de Rugby and Région Sud Regional Council. The group matches are scheduled in several regional host towns: Port-de-Bouc, Arles, Saint-Raphaël and Saint-Maximin, with the quarter-finals in Sisteron and Manosque, and Digne-les-Bains hosting the final rounds.

# 2024 OLYMPICS, RIGHT ON TRACK

It's official! The Olympic flame will be lighting up Marseille from Spring 2024. And it'll be arriving by sea, on board the three-masted Le Bélem...

#### **SAILING IN MARSEILLE**

The city of Marseille will be welcoming the Olympic sailing competitions scheduled from July 28th to August 8th, 2024: 12 days of non-stop action showcasing 330 athletes from 40 different countries competing in ten disciplines, including windsurfing, kite surfing, and dinghy and multihull sailing. The bay's aerological conditions and configuration, with no currents or tides, promise a top-quality sporting spectacle, plus interesting tactical and strategic play. On the spectator front, the Corniche coast road will be offering the public 2 km of panoramic views over the races and marina. The Olympic Marina, located at the former Roucas Blanc nautical stadium, will be the home base for the competing boats. The stadium's 7,000 m² of buildings have now been restored and redesigned. The Roucas Blanc basin has been a sailing hub since the 19th century and currently welcomes over 100 nautical events every year.

### 2024 OLYMPIC GAMES: FOOTBALL TOURNAMENTS IN MARSEILLE-PROVENCE AND NICE-CÔTE D'AZUR

The French team will be kicking off the Men's Olympic Football Tournament in Marseille on Wednesday July 24th, 2024, two days prior to the Olympic Games opening ceremony. We're crossing our fingers and toes! The Orange Vélodrome stadium will be the venue for nine additional tournament matches, with the Arena Allianz stadium in Nice welcoming five matches. Nice and Marseille will respectively be hosting three and five Women's Olympic Football Tournament matches.

# **2** VALLAURIS

I paint how others write their autobiography". Picasso discovered the "Town of a Hundred Potters" in 1936 and set up home there from 1948 to 1955. He began modelling clay in 1946: ceramics and linocuts testify to his genius. In 1959, he painted *War and Peace* in the castle's Romanesque chapel. The town also owes him the statue of the *Man with the Sheep*, installed on the market square.








#### LE HARMAS DU NATURALISTE JEAN-HENRI FABRE

### **OSÉRIGNAN-DU-COMTAT**

2023 is a great year for (re)discovering Jean-Henri Fabre, while his marvellous garden is sure to spur a vocation among young visitors! This visionary naturalist and author of *Entomological Memories*, born on December 21st, 1823, purchased *Harmas* - a Provencal farmhouse with a fallow garden - in 1879. Everything there has been carefully curated, or skilfully neglected, to promote biodiversity. Fabre's modern outlook becomes evident when you visit his home and garden, restored over a period of several months by the National Natural History Museum. The tour, which spans both the interior and exterior, encompasses rooms hitherto closed to the public. *Harmas* is a benchmark for entomologists and nature lovers worldwide. Jean-Henri Fabre observed countless insects there: cicadas, beetles, dung beetles, bees and more. The house harbours his precious collection of shells, fossils, herbaria, bird's nests, naturalist watercolours, printed works and manuscripts. You'll also visit Fabre's study, kitted out with microscopes, traps, breeding domes, etc. Two passionate gardeners take care of the garden, orchard and vegetable patch.

Tucked away in the heart of the village, this troglodyte wine cellar plunges visitors into the geology of the Châteauneuf-du-Pape wines, with a geo-sensory wine tasting experience courtesy of a collection of 1,500 tasters made of pewter, silver metal, wood, glass or ceramic, the oldest of which dates back to 1563. These traditional little utensils formerly allowed winegrowers - and fraud examiners - to inspect wines before tasting them. 

The Mas des Prêcheurs was erected on 36 acres of land on Montagnette hill in 1649. Today, it forms the core of a new wellness project led by Émilie Briand and Guillaume Multrier. A coach, logotherapist and professor at the Sciences Po university in Paris, Émilie specializes in therapy through meaning, i.e. giving a meaning to one's life and career by instilling them with one's own values. Renowned entrepreneur Guillaume Multrier is planning to install a pilot farm specializing in regenerative agriculture, which will eventually host over 200 vegetable varieties. The 800 m² Mas des Prêcheurs has now been converted into a guest house with five duplex rooms, each bearing the name of a sense: Touch, Hearing, Intuition, Taste and Sight. The rooms measure 25 to 80 m² and feature old beams, parquet flooring, reversible air conditioning, delightful natural materials (linen, wood), bathrooms with tub or walk-in shower and large windows overlooking the gardens, olive grove, cypress alley or courtyard and fountain. Sofa beds and baby cots are available on request. "We love families here", says Émilie who hosts workshops in the garden and parent-child cookery classes, in addition to private consultations. Meals are provided on request by chef and cheese maker Camille, with vegetarian dishes served at the fireside in the vaulted lounge, by the pool or next to the fountain. Evening meals can be also be left in the kitchen on request. The garden leads to a Montagnette hiking trail and is within easy reach of Saint-Victor chapel and the various Alpilles walking, cycling, riding and car routes.

After four long years, the restoration work on Marseille's Corniche Kennedy coast road – nicknamed the "world's longest bench" – has swept up a prize at the *American Concrete Institute Excellence Awards*.

A safe cycle path now runs along the Corniche for 2 kilometres. This new promenade also allows cyclists and walkers to rediscover the mosaics designed by art therapist Paola Cervoni, with the help of 140 partner associations and students from 55 schools: i.e., 201 metres of benches dressed in the colours of the sky and Mediterranean down below.

# LES ÉLÉGANTES

#### MARSEILLE

Nicknamed Les Élégantes, the five cranes on the city's sea wall have been saved once more after a close shave in 2001... Soaring to a height of 40 metres, these giants, commissioned in 1961 to develop port activity, are icons of Marseille's industrial legacy. Three years of restoration work, funded by the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur Regional Council and Grand Port Maritime de Marseille, were needed to restore them to their former glory.

Bookings - open to adults only - are online at least four days in advance, so the administration can check your record. You'll need ID too, mobile phones stay at reception and alcohol is prohibited. Restaurant access is via a small courtyard, at the remand centre. A guard at the entrance confides: "It's an excellent rehabilitation project. It helps visitors lose their preconceptions too and realize prison is a place where life goes on."

# MARSEILLE COFFEE BREAK

French people consume an average of 6 kg of coffee each every year. And would you believe it, the tradition first took root in Marseille! The city's merchants shipped coffee beans to the great Mediterranean port from the 15th century onwards. In 1644, Pierredela Roque returned from Constantinople with the equipment needed to roast the beans and prepare the magic brew.

France's first public café opened its doors near the city's Vieux-Port in 1671, under the impetus of Pascal Haroukian, an Armenian nicknamed Pascali. He baptized the venue and drink alike "café". The coffee fad spread so fast that doctors were alarmed. But its success never dwindled: magnificent cafés sprang up everywhere in the 19th century, including the *Café Turc* and *Café Riche*, where many artistic and political movements were born. Coffee is now an intrinsic part of French lifestyle... And it's resolutely here to stay!







His encounter with yoga teacher Maryline Schied prompted him to build a cabin complete with a meditation platform, tucked away among the spruces and larches of Bois Rond forest. You can climb up there to enjoy a Tibetan Singing Bowl sound bath while contemplating the peaks of Pic de Bure and mount Arrouze. The session ends with a cup of herbal tea or soup cooked over a wood fire. Pure magic.



# MOUNTAINEERING SCHOOL SITES • ÉCRINS NATIONAL PARK

Mountaineering is an art! And to learn it, opt for one of the 15 mountaineering school sites located near the Écrins' *Villages d'Alpinisme* mountaineering villages. The mountaineering school site concept is "one of a kind in France", in the words of Jean-René Minelli, a member of the *Compagnie des Guides Oisans Écrins* guide association. Its members have kitted out natural boulders, climbing routes and waterfalls for beginners at sites located adjacent to seven mountaineering villages. Examples include the Pic des Aupillous ridge (Vallouise-Pelvoux), Pantalon site (Le Monêtier-les-Bains), Fréaux ridge and Balmes boulders (La Grave), plus the route leading from Sirac to La Chapelle-en-Valgaudemar.

These committed initiatives are set to encourage younger generations to discover the beauty and values of mountaineering. The project is led by the Hautes-Alpes Agency for Economic and Tourism Development in partnership with Écrins National Park, and backed by European funding.

# **ÉCRINS NATIONAL PARK 50TH ANNIVERSARY**

♥ARGENTIÈRE-LA-BESSÉE

In 2023, Écrins National Park is celebrating the 50th anniversary of its official opening on March 27th, 1973. In fact, the park was born much earlier: its current core is that of the old Bérarde national park, created in 1913. 110 years ago, its aim was to protect the mountain from the impact of excessive grazing. In 1923, it was renamed Pelvoux national park and covered 32,000 acres. In 1960, France finally began creating national parks as genuine tools for the "conservation of fauna, flora, soil, subsoil, atmosphere, waters and the natural environment in general".

When the Parc National des Écrins – France's 5th national park – was set up in 1973, it had already been a conservation test site for 80 years. Now spanning 227,000 acres between the towns of Gap, Briançon and Grenoble, Écrins National Park has always been a scientific hub. Friendly scientific meetings are scheduled throughout the area for the park's 50th anniversary celebrations, with researchers and residents alike meeting up for a series of café-aperitifs, talks and field trips. June marks the peak of this year's events programme.

A call for projects has also been launched in the aim of creating public events at sites throughout the park.



HYÈRES-LES-PALMIERS FROM THE MAURES TO THE ESTÉREL HILLS

Aduo of giants, the Maures and Estérel hills stand guard over the flamboyant shores running from Hyères-les-Palmiers to Mandelieu-la-Napoule. Cloaked in deep green cork oaks and vines, the Maures hill chain stands guard over the Gulf of Saint-Tropez and is set to become the area's 10th Regional Nature Reserve.

Different but just as splendid, the red porphyry rocks of the Estérel hills embrace **Fréjus** and **Saint Raphaël**. The two towns are linked by the aptly-named Corniche d'Or coast road, which celebrated its 120th birthday just recently.

# VILLA NOAILLES 100<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY OHYÈRES

Now a national contemporary arts centre, this villa was commissioned by the Viscount of Noailles and his wife Marie-Laure de Noailles on land gifted to him by his mother for his wedding. "I am seeking an infinitely simple and practical home, where everything would be combined for a solely utilitarian purpose", wrote Charles de Noailles in 1924. Patrons of the arts and close friends with the stars of modern art, Charles and Marie-Laure's villa was one of France's first modern style constructions. A Cubist garden by Gabriel Guevrekian was added to the original Mediterranean garden in 1925.

The couple entertained such illustrious artists as Giacometti, Cocteau, Picasso, Dalí, Buñuel and Man Ray. Today, the Villa Noailles remains a foremost artistic meeting place, with a rich events programme dedicated to architecture (exhibition in February), fashion & photography (International Fashion & Photography Festival), and design (Design Paradein Hyères and Toulon). The villa is celebrating its centenary in 2023 with a series of exciting events from March to November, as well as reissued poems by Marie-Laure de Noailles and various other surprises, in particular on France's Heritage Days on September 16th and 17th.

#### **FORT DU PRADEAU**

#### ♥HYÈRES

It's often referred to as *La Tour Fondue* or "melted fort". And passengers sailing to the Levant islands embark at its feet.

This listed monument occupies the southern tip of Giens peninsula, part of Hyères-les-Palmier's *Grand Site* protected area and Port-Cros National Park. The public can now access the ramparts and discover the ancient drawbridge, barracks, guardhouse and other buildings, or savour the idyllic views over the Golden Islands from the terrace and paths connecting the various buildings. Amateur botanists will love discovering the site's protected plant species, such as sea lavender (*limonium pseudominutum*) and haircap moss (*plantago subulata*).

#### **MHAB**

#### **PROBLES-LES-MIMOSAS**

This nearly century-old *Musée de France* museum, nestling in the heart of the protected village of Bormes-les-Mimosas, has been completely redesigned. Its two main collections are now showcased under beautiful, 17th-century coffered ceilings, rising to a dizzy 8 metres in height. The Fine Arts rooms showcase works by Théo Van Rysselberghe, Emmanuel Charles Bénézit and Henri-Edmond Cross, while the ethnographic and archaeological collections immerse visitors in 2,400 years of the town's history, with augmented reality reconstructions courtesy of the Histopad and Histovery app issued at the start of the tour. Celtic-Ligurians belonging to the Bormani tribe settled on this vast territory as far back as 400 BC...

#### **MAISON FONCIN**

#### • CAVALAIRE

This magnificent abode belonged to geographer and historian Pierre Foncin, one of the founders of the Alliance Française. His daughter, Mireille, bequeathed it to the Conservatoire du Littoral coastal conservancy - their first donation - in 1977. Its white facade served as a landmark for sailors for many years. This year, its interior and exterior are opening to the public for the first time, every Wednesday. The 2½-hour guided tour introduces visitors to the story of the house and Foncin family, the arrival of the Train des Pignes train in Cavalaire and other chapters of history. Prior booking obligatory.

# MUSÉE DES TROUPES DE MARINE • FRÉJUS

Located 5 km from the town centre, at the gateway to the Maures hills, this military museum partially reopened in September 2022. Situated near the headquarters of the 21st Marine Battalion, it invites visitors to discover the history of France's Marine Troops. Part of the French Army, the marines originated from the navy corps created by Cardinal de Richelieu in 1622. Weaponry through the ages forms the common thread of the various collections. spanning over 120 showcases. The museum will be opening full-time in 2024, in celebration of the 80th anniversary of the Allied Landings in Provence.

# • HYÈRES

Set right on the waterfront, on this picturesque little harbour on Giens peninsula, this 1962 villa will be the venue for the Les chemins de l'abstraction exhibition, running all summer. The show features a selection of works from the private collection of entrepreneur Jean-Noël Drouin, a fervent fan of non-figurative paintings from the Fifties and Sixties. The exhibition shines a spotlight on 17 artists, including celebrities such as Pierre Soulages, Olivier Debré, Hans Hartung, Camille Bryen, Michel Carrade and André Marfaing. The interviews with each artist, conducted at the time by the philosopher Jean Grenier, are positively enlightening. Alongside the Carmignac Foundation in Porquerolles and Villa Noailles, this third venue is sure to delight contemporary 98 art lovers. Film buffs will also be able to (re)discover the mythical scene from *The Big Blue* shot at Niel harbour, while hikers can follow up their visit with a walk around the peninsula.

Abandoned in 1995, the ancient Salins des Pesquiers workers' village is a magnificent site, nestling at the heart of a protected pine wood opposite a beach facing Porquerolles island. The new Hameau des Pesquiers, powered with renewable energy, consists of twelve abodes including a "customs house", "canal house", two "sea houses" and four "glade houses", clustered around a church and connected via wooden paths in the sand. A holder of the European Eco label, it is the Côte d'Azur's first 5-starecolodge. One of the two main buildings houses the reception; the other is home to the spa and Saliniers restaurant, designed first and foremost as a living space open throughout the day. The Lelièvre family is deeply attached to the project: Stéphane and Adrian crafted the decoration – an eclectic mix of leather armchairs an old coffee maker and driftwood - themselves. Raw, natural and relaxing materials reign. You'll find beehives there too, plus a large vegetable garden, organic chicken coop, solar lighting and rainwater tanks for watering. On the other side of the road, production is currently being relaunched at the old saltworks, together with an ecomuseum.





# **CHÂTEAU DE VAUGRENIER**

### **♥** VILLENEUVE-LOUBET

Located 5 km from the town's medieval fortress, this Italian Renaissance chateau is the pearl of Vaugrenier Park, spanning 250 acres of Mediterranean shores. The chateau now welcomes groups of ten or more visitors and is also open on various dates set by the tourist office. Superbly restored over the past twenty years by the current owners, it features a typical Palladian central area, an oratory laden with stucco and magnificent vaulted rooms. The old sheepfold has now been converted into a reception hall.

#### **FONDATION MAEGHT**

#### **♥**SAINT-PAUL-DE-VENCE

The Maeght Foundation harbours a 13,000-strong modern art collection: one of the largest in Europe, with particular focus on works by Joan Miró and Alberto Giacometti. The site's refined architecture signed by Josep Lluís Sert has also earned it the "Remarkable 20th Century Architecture" label. But with over 130,000 visitors a year and an area of just 850 m<sup>2</sup> devoted to exhibitions, the foundation struggles to fit temporary shows alongside its permanent exhibits. Architect Silvio d'Ascia has now resolved the issue thanks to an "invisible" extension that respects the original construction: "The two new rooms slide under the two outer courtyards, dedicated to Miró and Giacometti, into the bedrock on which Sert placed his building. Nothing could be added, only taken away... So we dug into the embankment of the original sixties site to build new spaces, opening onto the pine wood to the south to form a dialogue with nature."

The foundation will be reopening in its "classic" form on July 1st, 2023. The extension work and underground layout are scheduled for completion in summer 2024, in celebration of its 60th anniversary.

### CANNES, SURFING AND MORE! • CANNES

Cannes is now the proud bearer of the Ville de Surf surfing city label awarded by the French Surfing Federation. And before you ask, you will find waves there, at the reputed Vague du Batéguier hotspot to the west of Île Sainte-Marguerite, Pointe Croisette, towards Palm Beach, or beach number 17 in front of the Thalès Alenia Space building. The label is awarded subject to stringent criteria: the town or city in question must be home to a French Surfing Federation club (in this case Cannes Jeunesse) and the municipality must take an active part in developing surfing and associated sports, including Stand Up Paddleboarding (launched in the framework of the 2016 "Cannes, outdoor sports capital" initiative. N.B. Surfing has been an official Olympic Games sport since the Tokyo Games.
