

We will be working diligently and with great humility to achieve the end result: the return of the Games to the world's leading ski area, the French Alps, across 4 clusters and 2 regions. We pledge to remain faithful to the Olympic spirit, with particular focus on athlete experience. This bid is an integral part of our "Une Cop d'Avance" climate plan and 100% green budget, the first in Europe.

The objective is clear: sober Games that open up the French Alps, considerably reduce financial costs and mark a return to the "snow and chalet" origins of the Winter Games. To all volunteers, athletes, and community and economic players: today we are calling on all those who wish to join forces with us to make this project a proud moment for the French Alps and for all.







Southern Alps, 10 reasons to prefer winter

The Southern Alps is addictive! Savour skies drenched in azure blue, married to perfection with dazzling white snow. Revel in vast, virgin and varied wide-open spaces, graced with Himalayan valleys, glowing gorges, dizzy peaks, high-altitude lakes, sunny cirques and verdant forests. You'll need to visit several times to explore it all: the friendly local villages and ski resorts, inhabited throughout the year, welcome you back like an old friend.

65 different mountain moods

High altitude villages dotted with sundials, contemporary resorts listed as 20th Century Heritage, 17th-century fortresses and hamlets immersed in larch trees: simply pick your dream getaway on the heights! **Saint-Véran** in the **Queyras** area – Europe's highest village – is famed for its larch log cabins known as fustes. **Superdvoluy**, **Les Orres** and **Isola 2000** are celebrated for their 20th-century architectural heritage. The Southern Alps' 65 ski resorts all have their own unique character, so why settle for just one "mountain break"?

Glorious scenery

The complex and rugged relief of the **Southern Alps** alternates peaks soaring to over 3,000 metres (**Barre des Écrins**, 4,102 metres, is the highest point in France), Himalayan valleys, high-altitude bocages, larch forests and plateaux swathed in lavender. Get ready to wallow in genepi and thyme! If you've had your fill of winter sports, venture out to explore the ancient local monuments, Vauban fortresses listed as UNESCO World Heritage and Baroque chapels.

Sunshine and pure air galore

Soak up the sun's rays and enjoy a real breath of fresh air! The sun shines 300 days a year in the Southern Alps and the air is among the purest you'll find anywhere. You won't find any major groups or polluting activities here: AtmoSud (a benchmark observatory for monitoring air quality in the **Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur** region), rarely pinpoints any pollution peaks. What's more, the massif's resorts are among the most innovative in Europe in terms of renewable energy production and mindful consumption.

An array of experiences to share

The Southern Alps' mild climate and varied geography have spawned a fantastic variety of experiences and activities for all ages. Families are welcomed warmly, children are extra-spoilt, shops and services are handy and you'll find friendly prices throughout the ski resorts. Auron, Valberg, Le Devoluy, Montgenèvre, Orcières-Merlette, Val d'Allos and Les Orres are all proud holders of the national Famille Plus (Family Plus) label.

Le Grand-Puy in the Alpes-de-Haute-Provence area ranks second among the Top 10 most-affordable ski areas according to the France Holidu search engine, with accommodation plus a ski pass priced at €39 per person per day! Tantalising tastes


Sea buckthorn, genepi, lavender and chard pie... The fondues here are flavoured with **Queyras blue cheese** and dishes are perfumed with plants that flourish between the Alps and Provence. Larchwood, or *Larix decidua*, was used to manufacture the Briançon area's very first skis. Today, in addition to providing roof trusses and cladding for the region's chalets, its resinous scent has become a culinary must-have, used in desserts, sweets and liqueurs, or slipped into savoury dishes.

Star-studded skies

The **Alpes Azur Mercantour** area was awarded the International Dark Sky Reserve label in 2019 in recognition of the exceptional quality of its night skies and efforts to reduce light pollution. Several resorts, including **Valberg** and **Les Orres**, bear the Starry Towns and Villages label, awarded to municipalities using a third less artificial light than average. Fancy a moonlit stroll?

Barcelonnette Observatory (Observatoire d'Astronomie)

Opening its doors this winter in the heart of the town's former military quarter, this new, Jules Verne-style observatory features two domes and a planetarium. A genuine cabinet of curiosities!



Big picture views

Take to the heights to contemplate the stunning summits of **Écrins**, peaks of **Mercantour**, ridgeline of Italy, sparkling **Mediterranean Sea** on the horizon, or frozen winter waters of a blue lake... In **Réallon**, you'll find no less than five belvederes offering breathtaking vistas, and even a platform teetering above **Serre-Ponçon** lake. You can reach them on skis or on foot from the top of the gondola lift.

A hub of traditional mountaineering

Mountaineering was classified as part of UNESCO Intangible Heritage in December 2019 and several villages have now been awarded the very-exclusive **Villages d'Alpinisme** (Mountaineering Villages) label, including **Pelvoux-Vallouise**, La Grave and **Le Monêtier-les-Bains** in **Serre Chevalier** Valley. Their motto? "Less But Better". These peaceful localities devoted to soft tourism cherish the mountain environment and boast a diverse and respectful mountain sports offering.






Dazzling!

Orcières-Merlette, Champsaur-Valgaudemar valleys

The 100 kilometres of slopes ascending to 2,725 metres are a genuine sight to behold. And the stunning views over Vieux-Chaillol, Pointe des Estaris and the various 3,000 metre summits of Écrins National Park are easy to reach too thanks to the Blue Label trails.

In 2023-2024, the ski area is also welcoming an exhibition of 65 large format photos visitors can admire on skis! Perched at an altitude of 1,850 metres, the cedar-lined resort of Champsaur never ceases to innovate. In 1967, it launched the very first Jardin des Neiges ski kindergarten, closely followed by a snow school in 1970 (which allows parents to ski outside school holidays at attractive rates). Other treasures include the Palais des Sports, igloos on Roche-Rousse plateau and charming hamlets of Prapic and Serre-Eyraud.

A dynamic duo Super Dévoluy and La Joue du Loup, Massif du Dévoluy

The two resorts of Dévoluy have a very different style but the same southern alpine charm: Dévoluy, a U-shaped massif with the peak of Bure as its highest point and Super-Dévoluy built around Le Bois d'Aurouze, aptly nicknamed the "Cruise Liner of the Snow". Listed as Remarkable Contemporary Architecture, it shares one hundred kilometres of slopes with the pretty wooden chalets of Joue du Loup. Treat yourself to a whirlpool bath facing the mountains at the Espace Odycéa. The Nordic area features around 40 km of multi-activity trails and offers sweeping views over Joue du Loup plateau and Brêche de Faraut in the distance.

La Grave is the ultimate playground for extreme skiing and freeriding aficionados and freeriders flock from the world over to tackle this high altitude, off-piste and ungroomed ski area nestling at the foot of the mythical summit of La Meije. But you don't have to be an adrenalin freak to appreciate La Grave-La Meije: savour the comforting food on offer at the local auberges, enjoy the breathtaking panoramic vistas from the Glaciers de la Meije cable car, revel in a fondue at the Refuge Chancel or slip into skis for the first time at the Chazelet ski resort ... The resort's Italian ski-in/ski-out connection has just been upgraded and that's great news, because our neighbours love this resort perched on the Italian border, on a mountain pass generously sprinkled with snow from Pô plain. You'll hear plenty of Italian spoken in the cosy wooden chalets on the snow front. You'll definitely want to whoosh over to Italy to savour sausage and polenta on the Colette green trail, or make the most of a free day in the Voie Lactée ski area - a whole 400 km of pistes leading to the 2006 Turin Winter Olympics site - when you book a 6-day package. France's oldest ski resort, this international hub features 110 km of pistes on two pleasantly-varied slopes, a 50,000 m² beginner's area (free of charge), modern cable car and panoramic toboggan not to mention a Durancia balneotherapy centre.



Recharge your batteries Serre Chevalier-Briançon, Guisane Valley

Serre Chevalier's 250 km of slopes span the heights of Guisane valley, between Briançon and Coldu Lautaret, making it one of the largest ski areas in France. The Prorel cable car glides its way over fortifications listed as UNESCO World Heritage. 80% of the ski area is set at over 2,000 metres and can be reached from three villages, including Monêtier-les-Bains home to Les Grands Bains du Monêtier - and La Salle-les-Alpes, where you'll be able to hop on the Pontillas gondola opening this winter. Thanks to the new gondola, a high-altitude snow front is scheduled for development on Méa plateau as part of its ground-breaking adaptations to climate change. Serre Chevalier is the first ski resort to produce a whole third of its own energy needs through the combined use of microturbines, hydroelectricity and solar panels. The destination is buzzing all year round, with no less than 5 four-star hotels and a record number of activities including farm tours within walking distance, snowkiting at Col du Lautaret and of course bouldering: Bloc 027, measuring nearly 630 m² and suitable for all levels, has just opened in Briançon.



Risoul 1850's wooden shingle-clad buildings form the beating heart of the resort, offering excellent transport services to and from Guillestre.


A holder of the Famille Plus label, Risoul is a paradise for kids, with activities including the safety-oriented "good skier" diploma, Waouland snowpark, and blue and green trails leading to numerous viewpoints... Resembling a little island on the border with Italy, nestling in the protective embrace of the Queyras Regional Nature Reserve, Abriès is an international benchmark in ski touring, ski mountaineering and ruisseling (hiking with crampons along the banks of frozen rivers). Perched at an altitude of 1,550 metres, this village resort promises virgin landscapes worthy of the Great North at the confluence of the Guil and Bouchet rivers. The new La Brune ski lift at the mouth of the Bouchet river uses roller technology to allow visitors to return to the resort on skis. The La Brune black slope has been redesigned, as has the ski-in/ski-out connection between Ruibon and Valpréveyre, winding its way through underwoods. The slopes, which also pass through Aiguilles and Ristolas, range from 1,550 to 2,450 metres above sea level. Niched under Tête du Pelvas (2,929 metres), the wild and natural ski area of Abriès offers 21 km of pistes and a 900-metre downhill run from the summit of Gilly, soaring to 2,450 metres.



The new Vars Speed Master whisks skiers and pedestrians over the Chabrières speed ski slope before landing them at an altitude of 2,750 metres. From this high point, you can gaze out over Mont Ventoux, the Mont-Blanc, Écrins massif and Serre-Ponçon lake, before heading to the ice cave, where around thirty ice sculptures on the Olympic Games theme await you. Vars is also home to 50 km of walking trails at altitudes of over 2,000 metres. 

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



Tucked at an altitude of 1,550 metres on the French border, the hamlet is surrounded by stunning peaks including the mythical Mont Bégo, revered by Neolithic shepherds... This haven of peace is just 1½ hours from the hustle and bustle of Nice by car, but a shuttle service from Saint-Dalmas-de-Tendestation also winds its way round the 46 bends you'll need to negotiate to get there.

Saint-Dalmas-le-Salvage

Two-thirds of Saint-Dalmas-le-Salvage - the highest village in the Alpes-Maritimes area - lie on the protected land of Mercantour National Park. Here, cross-country skiers enjoy warming up on a 3-kilometers loop, while ice waterfall enthusiasts test their skills in Gialorgues valley and ski tourers make a beeline for Col de la Braïssa, Sestrières plateau and more. The 50 km of snowshoeing trails also lead to Bousieyas, the highest hamlet in the Alpes-Maritimes (1,960 metres). In Provencal dialect, its name "bousihar" means "to blow a gale".

Today, it basks in nature's timeless luxury. Don't miss a visit to Vallée des Fonts, where chapels, mountain chalets and ancient fortifications stand guard over passing cross-country skiers. The 42 km of ski and ski skating slopes also spill over into the Laus area.

Southern Alps, a taste for all things local

The Southern Alps is resolutely committed to short distribution circuits and human-scale farms, with 78% of farms in the Alpes-Maritimes area spanning less than 6 acres.

A wide variety of produce, ranging from wines from France's highest vineyards, Protected Geographical Indication (IGP) red fruit and apples from the Alpes de Haute-Provence, home-grown cheeses, meats and cured meats, also lend the Southern Alps its very special character.

There's no shortage of curiosities here – like mushrooms grown in the old barracks of Mont-Dauphin, now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. You'll find these various delicacies at the local markets and farms: a whopping 38% of regional farms favour short circuits versus the national average of 21%.

Organic farming accounts for over a quarter of farmland, placing the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur region on top of the podium for this up-and-coming sector. With 40% of certified-organic land, the Hautes-Alpes is now France's leading area for organic farming, along with the Var department.

Cheeses, the heights of taste

Cow and ewe tommes, goat cheeses and cottage cheeses rub shoulders on every Southern Alps cheese platter.

The delicious Tomme du Champsaur and Bleu du Queyras are currently in the race for the coveted AOP label. Creamy Bleu du Queyras streaked with blue veins boasts a delightfully gentle taste, but beware - the mature version is nicknamed the "devil's kiss"! Fresh Champsaur tomme cheese is used to stuff the local tourtons - deep-fried puff pastry pillows - and Champsaur ravioles. Champsaur valley, home to Europe's largest mountain bocage, accounts for 40% of milk production in the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur region. You'll find lots of other cheeses there too, such as blue cheese from Col Bayard, Puimichel tomme, Valdeblore or Isola from the upper Tinée Valley.

Natural springs

Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur is France's leading French region for aromatic and perfume plants. Genepi, larch, lavender, juniper, thyme, savory and rosemary grow wild in the mountains and their incredible diversity inspires cooks, jam makers, syrup makers, herbal tea producers, liqueur makers, distillers and brewers alike. You'll find rare fruit juices (Les délices d'Orsatus) in the Southern Alps, as well as unique syrups (<u>l'Herbier du Dévoluy</u>) and even water from France's highest spring in **Montclar**. Local craft beers made with spring water are flavoured with thyme or genepi.

On the spirits side, the Southern Alps' exceptional elixirs include **Guillaumette dry** genepi, Lachanenche organic gin and larch liqueur courtesy of the **Distillerie des 4 Frères**, founded by 4 brothers who gather and distil their own herbs...

Puy-Saint-Vincent: a pilot for waste processing

A third of waste – in particular biowaste from food – is currently not recycled, despite the fact that source separation will be a legal obligation from December 31st, 2023. Puy-Saint-Vincent was the first mountain resort to organize biowaste collection and the resort was awarded the 2022 Cimes Durables trophy for its initiative.



Serre Chevalier:

a pilot for energy self-sufficiency

In winter 2023-2024, Serre Chevalier will be producing a whopping third of its own annual energy needs using a combination of three renewable energy sources: hydroelectricity, solar power and micro wind turbines. This ambitious initiative has inspired a number of other resorts belonging to the Compagnie des Alpes group.

Since April 2018, the resort has been flying the flag of the Interreg Alpine Space project, part of the European Smart Altitude programme. Its good practices include the use of microgrids (intelligent electrical networks) and raising awareness among holidaymakers and inhabitants alike through events such as the Game of Trees festival.

a pilot for building renovation

The resort is renovating its existing buildings to incorporate energy-saving and enhanced aesthetics alike. The facades are clad with thermal insulation prior to laying the traditional larchwood shingles - a local wood that does not require any treatment. Allocated by the resort, the Qualité Confort Hébergement label rewards establishments committed to eco-friendly practices.

Natural snowfall is preserved prior to the winter season thanks to plant shredding and the installation of snow barriers. Snow groomer drivers benefit from training in eco-driving and use biofuels and SnowSat software to optimize grooming times.

No less than fifty carpenters, producers, mountain guides, travel agents and hoteliers in the Queyras Regional Nature Reserve have been awarded the prestigious Valeurs Parc Naturel Régional label. 




