

Southern French Alpes, an Olympic hub of sustainable tourism

France's leading region for tourism, flying the flag of three international destination brands - Provence, Southern French Alps and Cote d'Azur -, the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur region is committed to responsible and sustainable tourism.

A little corner of France home to 5 million inhabitants, our region welcomes tourists from the world over in all seasons, come to savour our rich heritage, buzzing culture, exceptional scenery between sea and mountain, enviable lifestyle, fine food and legendary hospitality.

A forerunner for the ecological transition, the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur Regional Council voted Europe's first "100% green" budget.

Accounting for 40% of the region's territory, the Southern Alps is asserting its position as a 2024 benchmark for local, sustainable and sports tourism. Sustainability reigns here, reflected in vast, preserved natural areas, with 6 nature reserves including 2 national parks, a traditional Transhumance now listed as UNESCO Intangible Heritage and France's largest number of organic farms.

A cradle of champions, the Southern Alps is a haven of outdoor sports ranging from paragliding to hiking, mountaineering, sailing and a myriad of freshwater sports on lakes such as Serre-Ponçon, a training ground for the 2024 Olympic sailing events. The Olympic Flame will be stopping off, among others, on the whitewater banks of the river Ubaye.

Everyone knows that our mountains and lush valleys are a cyclist's paradise, home to the iconic mountain passes of the Tour de France, as well as mythical long-distance mountain bike routes such as the Transverdon.

Active wellbeing, pure air and an opportunity to reconnect with nature foster local tourism, with 4 out of 10 visitors coming from neighbouring areas.

Nurturing the flagship values of authenticity and simplicity, together with a delightful welcome and great variety of accommodation, the Southern Alps welcomes a wide public and seduces younger generations. It accounts for 10% of annual tourism consumption in Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur, i.e. 1.8 billion euros. Running until 2027, the 200 million euro Mountain Plan aims to provide even better amenities and improve mountain access, while continuing to honour the environment. A challenge driven by a much-awaited upcoming event: the 2030 Winter Olympics!

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SOUTHERN FRENCH ALPES, THE CYCLIST'S MOUNTAIN PLAYGROUND

Cycling is king in the Southern French Alpes! Whatever your preferred style road, mountain, gravel or BMX, with or without electrical assistance - the area's varied relief has something for every cycling occasion. Head out to roam green valleys, climb challenging slopes, revel in adrenalin-packed descents, tackle the Tour du Verdon or pedal along the stunning rocky balcony overlooking the Écrins glaciers. What's more, this vast playground is welcoming five stages of the Tour de France this year!

111TH TOUR DE FRANCE

Departing from Italy, this year's 111th Tour de France features a concentrate of Southern Alps challenges, with the mythical mountain passes of Briançon, Ubaye and the Route des Grandes Alpes, plus two forays into Dévoluy and the first ever stage in Superdévoluy. The 150-kilometre southern alpine final stage on July 19th promises to be sublime, with three climbs to altitudes of over 2,000 metres and up to 2,802 metres at the summit of La Bonette, Europe's highest road, prior to the finish line in Nice

A MYRIAD OF MOUNTAIN PASSES

The mountain passes of the Southern Alps are as regal as the summits themselves. You'll find dozens of them here, in addition to the seven in the spotlight of this year's Tour de France.

Ocol du Galibier 2 642 m

Total climb: 11.9 km (gradient 7.1%), then 17.7 km (gradient 6.9%).

A giant lying between the Northern and Southern Alps.

Elevation gain: 1,239 m from Valloire

Boasting a total of 64 Tours de France including 2024. In 2024, the 4th stage, spanning 138 km, will cross two legends: Col de Montgenèvre and Col du Galibier via Le Lautaret, a Tour de France classic.

O Col du Lautaret 2 050 m

Total climb: 27.7 km from Briançon. 11.3 km with a gradient of 9.2%, sometimes 10%.

Elevation gain: 853 m.



O Col d'Allos 2247 m

Total climb: 17.5 km from Barcelonnette, 22.50 km from Colmars-les-Alpes.

Elevation gain: 1,108 m. Average gradient 6.33%, Maximum 11%.

Ocol de la Bonette-Restefond 2 802 m

Total climb: 24 km from Jausiers or Saint-Etiennede-Tinée.

Elevation gain: 1,589 m.

Ocol d'Izoard 2 360 m

Total climb: 19 km from Briançon (gradient 6%) or 15.9 km via Gorges du Guil (average gradient 6.89%)

Elevation gain: 1,174 m (from Briançon).

O Col des Gondrans 2 347 m (VTT)

Total climb: 6.7 km from Montgenèvre.

Elevation gain: 519 m, average gradient 7.75%,

Maximum 10.2%.

Ocol de la Cavolle 2 326 m

Total climb: 29.1 km from Barcelonnette.

Elevation gain: 1,190 m. Average gradient 4.09%,

Maximum 8.2%.

BIKE PARKS UNDER THE LARCH TREES

Whatever your preference - cycle touring or extreme sports, cross-country, DH, BMX Trial, X-Country or Freeride, with or without electrical assistance -, mountain bikes are resolutely at home in our massifs. A myriad of bike parks, sometimes accessible via the ski lifts, allow aficionados to practise their art in all safety and open the way to a great choice of fun or challenging red, black and blue slopes. Here are a few examples:

Opigne-les-Bains: the Terres Noires trail has placed Digne among the downhill world's top-ranking names. The EVO Bike Park, often listed among the world's top ten bike parks, offers nine tracks and is open in all seasons.

Q La Moulière: since 1992. Coveted by riders for the sea views from some of its 12 downhill tracks and two touring MTB tracks.

- **Q** Le Dévoluy: 7 beautifully-maintained tracks and 1 Northshore track, with a total of 50 km of downhill adventures and two entrances located at Superdévoluy and La Joue du Loup, in the stunning mineral landscapes of the limestone Dévoluy massif.
- Montgenèvre: on the Italian border. Its 8 tracks ranging fom 2,450 to 1,860 m have made this park a benchmark. You'll find a wash and repair station there too.
- **Q Les Orres:** a fun, sporty and accessible playground at altitudes of 1,600 m to 2,600 m, sure to satisfy every MTB fan. The "Moniteur Cycliste Français" school provides training while the new "Pôle Sport Innovation" centre allows you to train virtually on an ultra-black slope at maximum speed.

- Pra Loup: the Clappe telemix serves 7 slopes of all levels, with a total of 18 km downhill runs and an elevation gain of 500 m. Beginners will enjoy the fun, free space, accessible via the Clapiers ski mat.
- **Puy-Saint-Vincent:** the base camp of world champion Jordan Sarrou. Gazing out over the Barre des Écrins, this bike park featuring a family trail welcoming kids aged 5 years upwards and mini MTB bike park, is a must for your first family rides.
- Vars: in 2023, Vars launched around 55 km of new electric mountain bike trails for cross-country enthusiasts including free charging stations, plus a new Downhill track, making a total of 125 km routes for all disciplines.
- **Q Seignus Val d'Allos:** the Enduro pioneer and organizer of the Tribe 10 000, Val d'Allos offers mythical singletracks starting out at an altitude of 2,371 metres, crowned with dazzling panoramic views 6 over Grande Séolane and Le Pelat at 3,051 m.

GFNY ORCIÈRES CYCLING FESTIVAL

A FIRST! ON AUGUST 24TH AND 25TH,

Orcières will be welcoming a stage of the GFNY: the largest amateur cyclosportive race, with 400 to 800 cyclists battling it out on a 158 km route across Champsaur valley, with an elevation gain of 4,400 m. Participants can take their pick from two options: "sporty" or "discovery". The event is backed by the newly-created Orcières Cycling Team – a first in the cycling world comprising three clusters: competition, leisure and events.

DURANCE BY BIKE

The recently-completed V862 "Durance à Vélo" trail, measuring 438 kilometres, runs alongside Provence's largest river. The scenery is simply stunning, from the river's source on the heights of Montgenèvre to its confluence with the Rhône in Avignon. Several railway stations allow you to hop onto this road bike and MTB route, in particular the high alpine stages stretching from Briançon to Sisteron in the Alpes-de-Haute-Provence.

TOUR DU VERDON

What better than a round trip for really getting to know a particular area? This sometimes-dizzy, 258-kilometre loop offers breathtaking views over the lower gorge of the Verdon Canyon and banks of the lakes of Sainte-Croix-du-Verdon and Esparron. Saddle up for four to seven days of pure magic.

Home to two national parks and four regional nature reserves, the majority of the Southern Alps territory remains untouched. Two of these protected natural areas - Écrins National Park and the Baronnies Provençales Regional Nature Reserve - are inter-regional, while Mercantour National Park and the Queyras Regional Nature Reserve, on the Italian border, operate transborder cooperation programmes with Italy's parks.

The Alpine massif is home to 691 protected sites, spanning 9.4% of the territory.

Many of the Southern Alps' leisure facilities, accommodation providers and local products bear the "Valeurs Parc Naturel Régional" or "Esprit Parc National" quality labels. The Southern Alps is also home to a record number of farms growing organic produce or selling direct from producer to consumer. You'll find a remarkable offering here in terms of soft pastoralism.

SOUTHERN FRENCH ALPES, THE HEIGHTS OF SUSTAINABILITY

TRANSHUMANCE, A SOUTHERN ALPS HERITAGE EVENT

In December 2023, the UNESCO listed the Transhumance - the seasonal droving of livestock by shepherds and breeders - as part of Intangible Cultural Heritage. The high-altitude pastures of the Southern Alps are at the core of this ancient and still very much thriving tradition.

Archaeological digs around Lauzanier lake have revealed that sheep breeding was practised near Col de Larche as far back as Neolithic times. Along with its neighbour, Col d'Allos, this mountain pass is home to some of the Alps' most-reputed pastures, perched at altitudes of 1,500 to 2,500 metres. In the Middle Ages, flocks of six to twenty thousand sheep were herded twice yearly along the cattle tracks running alongside the rivers Durance and Asse to the green meadows of Haute Ubaye. Today, flocks of around 620,000 sheep arrive in June, mainly in cattle trucks. Four to five hours after their departure from La Crau in the Bouches-du-Rhône area, they are disembarked next to the alpine pastures.

Their arrival is celebrated with numerous Transhumance fairs (in Vernet, Jausiers and Castellane to name but a few).

According to historians such as Henri Falgue-Vert, these seasonal movements of livestock allowed the mountain populations to mingle with the outside world. Farmers and shepherds alike were obliged to accompany the flocks, obtain the necessary authorisations, manage the traffic and seek out grassy pastures en route



NOÉ MARTIN, FRANCE'S BEST YOUNG SHEPHERD

Originating from Allos, in Val d'Allos, Noé Martin, aged just 16 years, swept up the title of France's Best Young Shepherd 2024 at the last Agricultural Show in Paris. Noé is proudly following in the footsteps of his father and stepmother, who run the "Fromagerie du Brec" cheese dairy in Val d'Allos. His family breed goats and hardy, red-headed Mourerous sheep.

GR®69 LA ROUTO®

Linking the plains of Provence to the alpine valleys of Piedmont, La Routo® (from the Occitanian expression far la routo in reference to the seasonal droving of livestock) spans 540 kms in the footsteps of the Transhumance. This stunning, long-distance trail is a genuine ode to the local accommodation providers, restauranteurs, sheep fairs and sheep products such as Arles merino wool - Europe's finest.

LA CABANE DE ROUANETTE IN ORCIÈRES

A great excuse for a family outing in Champsaur, La Cabane de Rouannette has just been restored with the aid of the Heritage Foundation. This cabin allows 9 shepherds to keep their flocks safe at night without having to walk too far. Departing from Archinard, in Orcières, the six-kilometre hike pans out under larch trees and along a torrent to a beautiful, flowering cirque.

PASTORANDO APP

In Allos, in Mercantour National Park, the Pastorando app provides real time geolocation of flocks, hence facilitating mountain sharing. Today, farmers use impressive Pyrenean Mountain Dogs known as patous to protect their sheep from wolves. The app allow you to circumnavigate them if you so wish.

The Buëch Dévoluy area and others employ mediators every summer to inform the public and ensure holidaymakers can get in touch with local shepherds and farmers.





c tanding shoulder to shoulder with the beautiful Southern Alps, the hills of Haute-Provence, rising 700 to 1,200 metres above sea level, pan out in the sunshine under a comfy forest blanket. Trees cover 70% of the 500,000 acres comprising the Baronnies Provençales Regional Nature Reserve. The cliffs of Orpierre and Céüze offer a thrilling vertical playground for climbing enthusiasts from the world over, while the Massif du Dévoluy, carved out with 600 hollows, is a haven for caving enthusiasts.

Guarding the gateway to this magnificent area, the Citadel of Sisteron stands on the Napoleon Road and Route du Temps heritage trail leading to Digne-les-Bains. Dotted with geological treasures, the trail offers stunning views over Lure mountain, a herbalist's paradise.

HOSPITALITY

LE GRAND LOGIS

♀LE CAIRE

This magnificent house on Place de Le Caire harbours many a treasure. The second floor, at the top of a grand staircase, features a billiards room and table tennis room, a 7-metre climbing wall and two spacious guest rooms, one for two guests (*Santorin*) near the terrace, gazing out over the mountain. Inspired, as its name suggests, by mountain refuges, the second room (*Le Refuge*) is clad in cosy wood and offers three bunk beds. Guests have access to the cellars converted into a spa with whirlpool bath, a musical grotto and massage room. Owner Arnaud Lecreux promises plenty of other upcoming surprises too.

LE DOMAINE DE COMBE BELUZE

MISON, SISTERON-BUËCH

Set between Méouge gorge and Sisteron's citadel, this 1678 construction surrounded by chestnut trees was abandoned for a long time. After five years of respectful restoration work, Anne Truphème has transformed the house into a tranquil haven complete with two barns for receptions. The five rooms are called *Vigne*, *Olive*, *Lavande*, *Pomme* and *Grenier* (*Grenier* still features graffiti dating from WWI). All are fitted with a kitchenette. The gites for two and four guests share a rooftop terrace. A summer kitchen with pizza oven, BBQ and brazier is available near the main courtyard lined with veteran cedar trees. Three natural springs supply water to the pool. The estate can be privatized for a day or weekend.

Located just outside Digne and a ten-minute walk from the thermal baths, the Refuge des Sources underwent a 4-month facelift before reopening in summer 2023 as a three-star hotel. Architecture firm A26 Igloo has instilled the 60 rooms - some ideal for families or groups of 6 - with a cosy feel. The delightful pool and terrace are open in summer. You can also opt for a package deal including accommodation and treatments at the Haute Provence spa. General Manager Vanessa Delmas offers spa guests an extra-special welcome, while Chef Matthieu Bonnoure pays tribute to local produce at *La Table du Refuge*.

You'll also enjoy a visit to Aurore Tenoux, a local walnut grower and holder of the "Valeurs Parc Régional" quality label. Other activities on the menu include hikes to Le Duffre, the highest point of the Baronnies Provençales Regional Nature Reserve. Concocted by the Sisteron Buëch Tourist Office, this magical experience, lasting 3 days and 2 nights, was awarded a prize by ADN Tourisme, the National Federation of Tourism Institutions.

On the other side of the iconic Vieux Chaillol, Valgaudemar could easily be mistaken for a Himalayan valley... Pic de Bure, the region's largest observatory, gazes over the mineral landscapes of the Massif du Dévoluy. Its chourums - mysterious natural hollows formed from karst - attract cavers from the world over in both summer and winter, while botanists flock here to contemplate the local flora.

The village boasts an exceptional religious heritage on three levels, connected by a maze of stone staircases. 22 of the "Plus Beaux Villages de France" are located in Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur. The label is awarded subject to 32 criteria: in addition to its aesthetics, the village must have at least 2,000 inhabitants and be home to two protected sites. The label was created in the stunning village of Gordes in the Luberon, honoured with the title of "Most Beautiful Village in the World" by the American magazine Travel + Leisure in 2023.

Now a proud holder of the "Bistrot de Pays" label, pastry chef Michel concocts traditional dishes with a twist such as Guinea Fowl Wellington and Veal Blanquette, served at the Endrone restaurant with terrace overlooking the mountains, open from Thursday to Monday. Wind the day up with an unrefined cocoa tea from Saint Lucia - Gwen's birthplace - or Caribbean cocktail. The five double rooms and two dormitories with 6 to 8 beds are refurbished every spring. You can also swim in one of France's cleanest rivers, the Esteron, just down from the hotel. Aiglun is a popular meeting place for canyoning enthusiasts, also home to many hiking trails criss-crossing the Préalpes d'Azur Regional Nature Reserve.
