

A FRENCH EXPLORATION OF THE OLYMPIC GAMES

Exactly 100 years after the last Summer Olympics in Paris, France is once again gearing up to be in the international spotlight with the most prestigious and anticipated sporting event in the world. From 26 July to 8 September 2024, the French capital will host 15 days of Olympic competitions followed by 10 days of Paralympic events. With an estimated global audience of 3 billion viewers, Paris plans to redesign urban spaces to host athletes against spectacular backdrops. It will be an unparalleled opportunity for France to showcase its expertise in organising large-scale events, while highlighting its commitment to sustainability and inclusion.

INNOVATIVE SITES AT THE HEART OF CSR

Taking a dynamic and innovative approach, the Paris Olympic and Paralympic Games promise surprising sports competitions in iconic and unexpected locations such as the foot of the Eiffel Tower, the Grand Palais, Les Invalides, the Place de la Concorde, the Château de Versailles and even on the Seine. Beyond their aim for an immersion in France's rich cultural heritage, the Games place environmental sustainability and social responsibility at the heart of their efforts, with clear commitments to the issues of inclusion, gender equality and accessibility. From Lille to Marseille via Saint-Étienne, Bordeaux, Lyon, Nice, Nantes and Châteauroux, without forgetting French Polynesia and the legendary Teahupo'o waves for surfing, the whole of France will be the stage for intense competition in the most iconic sports venues. These Games promise a memorable Olympic and Paralympic celebration.







THE OLYMPIC TORCH RELAY FROM OLYMPIA TO PARIS

The journey of the Olympic flame over several months is an essential tradition linked to the history of ancient Greece. On 16 April 2024, the torch will be ignited by the sun's rays in Olympia, Greece. This symbolic gesture underscores the divine origin attributed to the sacred fire. It marks the start of a long journey to France, with an arrival in Marseille on 8 May. From there, it will travel through numerous cities during a 69-day relay, until the opening ceremony in Paris, scheduled for 26 July. A journey to highlight wonderful sites and convey a universal message of peace and unity between nations around the world.

ACROSS FRANCE

THE TOUR DE FRANCE 2024

Scheduled from 29 June to 21 July 2024, the Tour de France will start in Florence, Italy and finish in Nice. This modification of the route is as a consequence of the Olympic Games in Paris. For the first time in history, the Tour will not finish in the French capital and the honour of hosting the last stage of the 111th Tour will instead go to Nice. It introduces a series of new stages and challenges, including a climb of the Col du Galibier on the fourth day, sections on unpaved roads in Troyes, the highest point on the summit of Bonette, and a decisive time trial in the last stage.

The third Tour de France Femmes, scheduled from 12 to 18 August 2024, will for the first time start from outside France. The route will take riders from the city of Rotterdam in the Netherlands to the slopes of the Jura Mountains and the Alps, culminating in a finish at Alpe d'Huez.

REOPENING OF NOTRE-DAME DE PARIS

Notre-Dame de Paris, a jewel in the world's historic heritage, is preparing for its spectacular reopening at the end of 2024. After the fire in 2019, restoration efforts have been stepped up to welcome back visitors and admirers on 8 December 2024, promising a memorable rebirth of this iconic monument.

PARIS REGION AND NORMANDY

150 YEARS OF IMPRESSIONISM

In 2024, France is celebrating the 150th anniversary of the first Impressionist exhibition in Paris. Monet, Renoir, Morisot, Degas, Pissarro, Sisley and Cézanne unveiled works that would profoundly change the course of art history. To mark this historic date, the Musée d'Orsay is staging an exceptional exhibition, "Paris 1874. Inventing Impressionism". Alongside this exhibition, the virtual reality experience "An evening with the Impressionists. Paris 1874" invites you to relive the inauguration of the first Impressionist exhibition as a Parisian in 1874.

The anniversary will also be celebrated at the Normandy Impressionist Festival from 22 March to 22 September, with a focus on artistic innovation and tributes to world-renowned artists such as Whistler, Wilson and Hockney throughout Normandy. In Nice, the "Berthe Morisot à Nice, escales impressionnistes" exhibition highlights the impact of Berthe Morisot's stays on the Riviera, particularly in relation to those produced by Renoir and Monet. Events across France mark a national tribute to the Impressionist movement, highlighting its lasting impact on art.

NORMANDY

THE 80TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE D-DAY LANDINGS AND THE BATTLE OF NORMANDY

At midnight on 6 June 1944, over 150,000 allied soldiers from around 15 nations turned the tide of the Second World War. That day, to put an end to Nazism, 10,500 men were killed, wounded or taken prisoner. What followed were three months of battles to liberate Normandy, then Paris, and finally all of Europe. This complex operation unfolded across the five beaches of Utah, Omaha, Gold, Juno and Sword, as well as at Pointe du Hoc. These 80 kilometres of Normandy coastline are filled with countless places to visit, including 44 museums, 29 cemeteries and 21 natural sites - all key Remembrance tourism sites, essential for passing on the history of this crucial period to future generations. Every year, museums in the region offer special programmes including lectures, documentaries and exhibitions. To commemorate peace and reconciliation, the 18th D-Day Festival, running this year from 1 to 16 June, will offer around 100 activities at Omaha Beach, in the presence of heads of state and international representatives. Some of the highlights include a spectacular drone show over the five D-Day beaches, an international peace march and a giant picnic on Omaha Beach itself.

Cycle tourism is on the rise!

In the ever-changing landscape of global tourism, this booming trend combines discovery and sustainability. With 21 major signposted itineraries, carefully designed urban routes, over 1,000 cycle loops and a selection of major mountain bike crossings, not forgetting the legendary passes of the Tour de France, France offers a rich and varied exploration of its territories.

France Vélo Tourisme invites adventurers and families to discover the beauty and diversity of the French countryside on these safe cycle routes, offering a unique and sustainable way to experience heritage, culture and local gastronomy to the rhythm of your pedal strokes.

With 20,755 km of cycle routes in 2023, France aims to become the world's leading destination for cycle tourism by 2030. The Accueil Vélo label guarantees cyclists a full range of quality services, covering accommodation, bike hire and repairs, restaurants, tourist offices and tourist sites, for an optimum cycling experience. The sector generates an estimated turnover of €4.2 billion, with a significant proportion of the French population cycling on holiday.







The objective for 2030 is ambitious: to extend the network of cycle routes to 25,587 km. To date, the 'Schéma National des Véloroutes' or SNV (National Cycle Route Plan) includes 20,755 km of open routes and 48,900 km of cycle loops, with 465 km being added to the SNV in 2023. The 17 EuroVelo routes, 10 of which are in France, play a crucial role in cycling integration and connection across Europe.

This expansion of cycle tourism in France, supported by strategic investments and a constantly evolving infrastructure, underlines the country's commitment to sustainable and environmentally friendly tourism. It offers a unique opportunity for tourism journalists to highlight a dynamic sector that promotes a greener and more intimate approach to discovery tourism, while stimulating the local economy and preserving France's natural and cultural riches.

Hiking towards new horizons

Hiking is the most popular sport in France, enjoyed by over 27 million people, or 56% of the nation. It appeals for its accessibility, its intergenerational aspect and its wellbeing benefits - and is steadily growing. With 227,000 kilometres of paths, marked and maintained by nearly 9,500 volunteers, France offers a diversity of landscapes to explore, noting particularly the iconic GR®20 in Corsica, GR®34 in Brittany and GR®10 in the Pyrenees. Created in 2017 to support Paris' candidacy for the Olympic Games, the GR75 explores the emblematic and popular districts of the capital, passing through the parks of Boulogne and Vincennes. It provides an immersion into the Olympic history of Paris, connecting the sites of the 1900 and 1924 Games, and those to come in 2024. All illustrate a commitment to discovering natural and cultural heritage, reflecting a quest for a healthy lifestyle and a connection with nature.

River trips that go with the flow

With 8,500 km of waterways including rivers and canals, France has the largest navigable network in Europe, a true feat of engineering and territorial planning. This network offers a wide range of experiences, from short boat trips to multi-day cruises. Of the jewels of this fluvial heritage, particularly noteworthy are the Loire Valley and Burgundy canals, which combine exceptional architectural heritage with local food and wine; the famous Canal du Midi, whose tranquil landscapes are listed by UNESCO; the Marne-Rhine canal which winds through the regional natural park of Lorraine, the Vosges and the Alsace plain; without forgetting the majestic Seine! The combination of canals and towpaths creates ideal holidays that are both active and restorative, allowing you to explore France at a leisurely pace. This concept takes advantage of the 'Accueil Vélo' label, specifically tailored to the needs of cycle tourists. This synergy aligns perfectly with the slow tourism trend, promoting a deep immersion in natural splendours and local cultural heritage, while stimulating the economy and the attractiveness of the regions crossed. Known as 'fluvestre' tourism ('fluvestre' being an amalgamation of 'fluvial' and 'terrestre'), this hybrid approach constitutes an opportunity to see France anew from an original and environmentally friendly position.



JURA MOUNTAINS

GRAVEL ADVENTURES ON THE GREAT JURA CROSSING

From spring 2024, the Jura Massif is opening up to cyclists with 380 km of routes designed for gravel enthusiasts, a hybrid form of cycling ideal for leaving the tarmac behind and exploring varied terrain. Whether you're an experienced cyclist or a novice seeking accessible routes, these itineraries will lead you into the beauty of the Jura Mountains, from the Maîche plateau to the Alpine panoramas of Mont d'Or, passing through the dense forests of the Hautes Combes, territory of the capercaillie and the Eurasian lynx. The routes offer two choices: a heritage route via La Praille for a more leisurely experience, or a sporting challenge towards the Col du Grand Colombier. An exceptional experience in the natural landscapes of the region and a wonderful opportunity to meet local producers at every stage.

LIGHTHOUSES OF BRITTANY: **UNIQUE STAYOVERS**

In the summer of 2024, the great lighthouse of the Ile de Sein, a historic gem located at the tip of Brittany, will be transformed into a cosy cottage with panoramic views of the Atlantic. Surrounded by one of the stormiest seas in France, this accommodation will sleep 15, ideal for family reunions or get-togethers with friends. Towards the end of the year, the bay of Morlaix will also reintroduce a well-kept secret: the Île Noire lighthouse, known for its mysterious appearance and its emblematic silhouette. Currently undergoing renovation, the structure will be reinvented as an exceptional place to stay. These two renovation projects underline the commitment to Breton maritime heritage. while offering innovative and environmentally friendly tourist experiences.

THE FULL GT20 WITH APPEBIKE

Whether you're an experienced cyclist or a novice, Corsica is the perfect terrain to indulge your passion. Embark on the GT20 adventure, a cycle-tourism journey that crosses the Isle of Beauty from Bastia to Bonifacio, and vice versa. This 600 km route, with a total of 10,000 metres elevation gain, reveals a mosaic of sea and mountain landscapes. The stops in authentic Corsican villages also encourage you to meet local producers. Designed to adapt to all levels, whether you are on a road bike or have electric assistance, this 12-stage crossing requires five to eight days for the fittest. Love a challenge? From 8 to 12 May 2024, take up the gauntlet with the third holding of the Corsica Cyclo GT20 event!

GRAND EST MICRO-ADVENTURE ON THE UNSPOILT MEUSE

Nestled between Champagne and Alsace, halfway between Paris and Strasbourg, the Meuse discreetly reveals itself as a gem of French tourism. Fancy a two-day micro-adventure? Glide across the clam yet invigorating waters of the Meuse in a canoe or kayak. This route stretches over several kilometres, beginning in Pontsur-Meuse, an accessible starting point with easy launching. The route then leads towards Saint-Mihiel, winding through areas renowned for their biodiversity (birds, fish and plant life). The route offers breathtaking views of seemingly timeless villages, including historical monuments and even remnants of the First World War.

HAUTS-DE-FRANCE

ALONG THE VÉLOMARITIME (EUROVELO 4)



This spectacular route winds along 1,500 km of the coast of northern France, from Dunkirk to Roscoff. This route, completed in 2021, offers you a unique cycling adventure, with sections suitable for both long-distance journeys and short breaks. It connects the North Sea, the English Channel and the Atlantic, and crosses Hauts-de-France, Normandy and Brittany. Along the way, cyclists travel between spectacular landscapes, historic towns and picturesque seaside resorts such as Wimereux, Le Touquet-Paris-Plage and Saint-Valéry-sur-Somme. The Vélomaritime promises an experience rich in discoveries, from the coastline of the Pink Granite Coast to Mont-Saint-Michel, via the Landing Beaches and the cliffs of Étretat. A beautiful adventure passing through the exceptional heritage of the region.

SCOOTERS AND GASTRONOMY IN QUIBERVILLE-SUR-MER



Here is a unique outdoor experience just a few kilometres from Dieppe, on an all-terrain electric scooter. The excursion begins in Quiberville to learn the subtleties of off-road riding, at a maximum speed of 25 km/h. The route promises great exhilaration, especially on the descents. It takes the GR*21, famous for its breathtaking views of the cliffs and the sea, before diving into the Longueil marsh and crossing woodlands dotted with beautiful mansions and maritime pines. A stop at the Vasterival valley reveals an unspoilt beach at the foot of the ochre cliffs, while a visit to the Ailly lighthouse highlights the singularity of the local vegetation. The day ends in Sainte-Marguerite-sur-Mer with an aperitif on the beach and a tasting of local products while admiring the sunset.

THE MARAIS POITEVIN AND RECOGNITION OF THIS EXCEPTIONAL ECOSYSTEM

On 1 December 2023, the Marais Poitevin (also known as the Green Venice) received the prestigious Ramsar label, an international distinction which highlights the ecological importance of this wetland, comparable to renowned sites such as the Everglades. Announced by the Ministry of Ecological Transition, this label highlights the exceptional role of the Marais Poitevin in the preservation of biodiversity on the Atlantic coast. With 337 recorded bird species, over 1,000 plant species and a vast hydraulic network of 8,200 km, it constitutes a remarkable area of biodiversity. This recognition strengthens its efforts towards sustainable management, increases its visibility internationally and paves the way for new funding opportunities. A significant step towards the enhancement and conservation of this unique natural heritage.

LA DURANCE BY BIKE




Follow the course of the most important river from the Southern Alps to Provence by bike! Stretching over 170 kilometres from Serre Chevalier to Sisteron, the Durance cycle route passes through historic sites and remarkable landscapes. From Briancon, a town of art and history, it crosses the Guisane valley, revealing a mining heritage, and the Écrins National Park, where breathtaking views reward the effort of the climbs. The route then descends to charming villages, winding through lush green countryside and passing through the peaceful village of Bâtie-Vieille. Along the way, panoramic views of the Ecrins and Dévoluy massifs await you. Gap welcomes cyclists with its colourful facades and the Domaine de Charance, followed by Chateauvieux. The route skirts the Château de Tallard, then the Lac de Serre-Poncon, concluding this cycling adventure through the natural and cultural heritage of the Southern Alps.

AUVERGNE

THE ROYAL MONASTERY OF BROU, A FRENCH-STYLE TAJ MAHAL

The Royal Monastery of Brou, built in Bourgen-Bresse, is an architectural masterpiece and a poignant testimony to the love between Margaret of Austria and her husband Philip le Beau. Founded at the beginning of the 16th century, this monument commemorates their exceptional union and the deep affection of the Duchess of Savov for the heir of the Netherlands and Duke of Burgundy, who died prematurely. With Margaret's initiative, this construction reflects the intensity of their bond through the church, the cloister and the majestically decorated tombs, illustrating the grandeur and romanticism of this lost love. Each aspect tells this epic tale of eternal love, immersing visitors in a time when royal feelings transcended trials. Steeped in romance, the monastery reveals itself as a timeless sanctuary of love, frozen in stone and history.

THE CHÂTEAU DU RIVAU: HISTORY AND ECOLOGY

The Château du Rivau is just 15 minutes from Chinon in south-west Touraine, and unfolds as a vibrant chapter of history, gracefully blending medieval heritage with Renaissance charm. Since its acquisition in 1992 by the Laigneau family, it has been lovingly restored, skilfully combining history with contemporary art exhibitions in a sumptuous setting. Known for its listed stables and its collections of works of art, it also hosts 'La Table des Fées', a locavore restaurant distinguished by the Clef Verte label, which is committed to responsible eating by favouring local produce, with fruit and vegetables straight from its garden. Environmentally aware, Rivau boasts two conservatories dedicated to preserving biodiversity and rejects the use of pesticides in its gardens.


CORSICA

THE NAPOLEONIC GROTTO: A JOURNEY THROUGH TIME FROM 1769

Of the emblematic figures who left an indelible mark on Corsica, Napoleon Bonaparte holds a central place. Born in Ajaccio in 1769, he grew up among the winding streets and houses with colourful shutters, a setting that shaped and enriched his imagination. Just steps away from Maison Bonaparte, the city invites you on a journey back in time with the Grotte Napoléon. This intimate space, crafted from stone, carries visitors back to the youth of one of the most significant leaders in French history through a video projection. It is the perfect opportunity to enjoy a 'spuntinu', an assortment of local delicacies - Corsican cheese, charcuterie such as figatellu or lonzu - served with fresh bread and sometimes accompanied by olives or garden vegetables. This immersive experience perfectly combines culture, history and gastronomy.

THE LATEST FROM MAISONS TAITTINGER AND RUINART

The unique character of Maison Taittinger shines through, while Maison Ruinart has been a profound influence on the history of champagne through its creativity and commitment to the environment. Anchored in tradition for almost a century, they continue to revolutionise the wine industry by combining heritage and the avant-garde. Their quest for excellence is reflected in their cuvées, which combine ancestral craftsmanship with innovation. In 2024, the city of Reims will welcome two new places to celebrate champagne. Maison Taittinger will invite visitors to explore its historic Crayères with a new look tour, revealing the secrets of its centuries-old cellars. Maison Ruinart will open the doors to a tasting space designed by the famous architect Sou Fujimoto.

RESPONSIBLE IMMERSION IN LA ROCHELLE

Explore La Rochelle in five days for a unique experience where history, nature and culture blend harmoniously. Whether on foot, by bike, by bus or train, this getaway takes you from historic districts to the impressive cliffs of Pertuis Breton. As soon as you arrive at the station, stop at the tourist office to pick up your 'Ocean Pass', granting you unlimited access to transport and the city's must-see sites. Head to the top of the historic Saint-Nicolas towers and to the lively central streets, passing through museums, the aquarium and the workshops of local artisans. Set sail on a maritime adventure with a catamaran cruise with Kapalouest, or follow the Vélodyssée to Châtelaillon along the coastline. Finally, try some of the locally sourced flavours from producers and restaurateurs.

LA MAISON CARRÉE: OCCITANIE'S 10TH UNESCO JEWEL

Since 18 September 2023, Nîmes has shone with a new star on the international stage thanks to the classification of the Maison Carrée as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO, thereby recognising its exceptional value. This temple is the best preserved of the ancient world and reinforces the prestige of the city nicknamed the 'French Rome', alongside treasures such as the arenas, the Tour Magne and the Temple of Diana. As a strategic location, it has been a prime witness to the mingling of ancient civilisations, playing a pivotal role in the network of Mediterranean trade. More than just relics of the past, these structures embody the vibrant legacy of an ancient culture that continues to inspire and educate, affirming Nîmes' position as a lively capital of ancient culture.

Founded in the 12th century by Robert d'Arbrissel, the royal Abbey of Fontevraud stands out as one of the largest monastic cities in Europe, profoundly influencing medieval history. Unique in its kind, it was led by abbesses, several of whom came from royal families. As the chosen burial place of the Plantagenets including Henry II, Eleanor of Aquitaine and Richard the Lionheart, it has been of significant historical importance across the centuries. It was converted into a prison during the French Revolution but survived the vagaries of history to be rehabilitated and classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. In 2024, the Fontevraud Abbey is set to host two events: an exhibition dedicated to the painter Bernard Buffet from 8 June to 29 September and a celebration of the 900th anniversary of Eleanor of Aquitaine.

Initiated by the Bishop of Inguimbert, the Hôtel-Dieu reflected his desire to heal the body and enrich the mind through culture and knowledge. Embracing a humanist vision, it houses an exceptional collection of nearly 250,000 volumes, including 70,000 ancient works, not counting paintings, prints, ancient artefacts, coins, medals and scientific instruments. The public will have the chance to explore a multimedia reading library, heritage collections with guided tours and a permanent exhibition. The opening is scheduled for 19 April.




