









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

BIATHLON

Germany's national sport inspired by cross-country skiing, the summer version of this dual discipline combines rifle shooting with roller skiing or running.

Unique in the Southern Alps, **the new Ceillac 4 Seasons Biathlon** stadium, perched at an altitude of 1,650 metres, is opening to the public and clubs for the first time this summer. It features three roller ski courses (0.9 km, 1.5 km, and 2.5 km) and a 50-metre shooting range with fifteen 50-metre mechanical targets and ten 10-metre targets.



DURANCE by bike


You'll soon be able to pedal along the **Durance River** from its source on the heights of Montgenèvre in the Southern Alps all the way to its confluence with the Rhône in Avignon, Provence. The Sisteron-Manosque stage, one of the high-Alpine stretches of the "Durance à Vélo" or V862 cycle route, is now ready to roll, with signposting on the section between Mallemort and La Roque d'Anthéron. When finished, the V862 is set to follow the course of Provence's largest river for an impressive 438 km! You can join the route easily from various train stations by road bike or mountain bike.





POSTMAN'S HIKE

The "Chemin du Facteur" crosses the path of potters, blacksmiths and wild plant gatherers – but despite its name, you're unlikely to come across anyone from the Post Office!

The Chemin du Facteur was used to take letters from Rosans to Ste-Marie-de-Rosans until 1925. This 13-km / 4.5 hour trail leads along a shaded path and crosses the hamlet of Raton and Col de la Fromagère-Pommerol before arriving at the village of Rosans, home to many talented artisans and craftspeople.

150th ANNIVERSARY OF THE SOUTHERN ALPS' FIRST RAILWAY LINE

A train arrived for the first time in Veynes, in the Southern Alps, in 1875, thanks to local engineer Adrien Ruelle, an employee of the **Paris-Lyon-Mediterranean Railway Company (PLM)**. Veynes is at the centre of the so-called **"Veynes Star"**, serving Marseille to the south, Briançon to the north, Valence to the west and Grenoble to the (north-)east. It is a genuine technical feat, laced with steep uphill and downhill sections.

The arrival of the railway revolutionized life in the Southern Alps: normally trodden on foot, the transhumance (moving of flocks to their summer and winter pastures) could now be done by rail, while ice - much-needed to chill the pastis served on Marseille's Vieux-Port - could now arrive in a carriage...

Today, the station is served by Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur regional express trains and the Paris-Briançon night train. Veynes will, of course, play a major role in planning and preparing the 2030 Winter Olympics in the French Alps..

UNDERSTANDING THE CHALLENGES OF WATER MANAGEMENT

The construction of Serre-Ponçon dam in 1962 was an incredible adventure and genuine technical feat. It is one of the only "earth fill" dams in Europe, with a base spanning an impressive 650 metres. You can admire its architecture to the full from the stunning belvedere overlooking the lake and mountains.

The "Maison de l'Eau et des Energies" (Water & Energy Centre) offers visitors a fascinating insight into hydroelectricity production, renewable energy sources, the construction of the Durance-Verdon dams and challenges of water sharing through interactive modules, videos and touchscreens.

A CYCLIST'S MOUNTAIN PLAYGROUND



Cycling is king in the Southern French Alpes! Whatever your preferred style - road, mountain, gravel or BMX, with or without electrical assistance - the area's varied relief has something for every cycling occasion. Head out to roam green valleys, climb challenging slopes, revel in adrenalin-packed descents, tackle the Tour du Verdon or pedal along the stunning rocky balcony overlooking the Écrins glaciers.

A MYRIAD OF MOUNTAIN PASSES

The mountain passes of the Southern Alps are as regal as the summits themselves. You'll find dozens of them here, in addition to the seven in the spotlight of the Tour de France.

Ocol du Galibier 2,642 m

Total climb: 11.9 km (elevation gain 7.1%), then 17.7 km (elevation gain 6.9%). A giant lying between the Northern and Southern Alps.

Elevation gain: 1,239 m from Valloire Boasting a total of 64 Tours de France.

DURANCE BY BIKE

You'll soon be able to cycle along the river Durance all the way from its source on the heights of Montgenèvre to its confluence with the Rhône in Avignon. The Sisteron-Manosque stage – one of the high alpine sections of the "Durance à Vélo" V862 cycle route – has now been completed.

The stretch running between Mallemort and La Roque d'Anthéron is already signposted. The V862 will ultimately follow Provence's longest river over 438 km. Various train stations along the way allow cyclists and mountain bikers to join the route at any time.

ENDURO DES TERRES NOIRES #6 MASSIF DES ALPES-DE-HAUTE-PROVENCE

After an almost two-year absence, this physically and technically-demanding race for experienced riders is back in the saddle. You can also sign up your kids for the "Street Race Kid".

Here are a few examples:

O DIGNE-LES-BAINS

The Terres Noires trail has placed Digne among the downhill world's top-ranking names. The EVO Bike Park, often listed among the world's top ten bike parks, offers nine tracks and is open in all seasons.

O LA MOULIÈRE - CAILLE

Since 1992. Coveted by riders for the sea views from some of its 12 downhill tracks and two touring MTB tracks.

Q LE DÉVOLUY

7 beautifully-maintained tracks and 1 Northshore track, with a total of 50 km of downhill adventures and two entrances located at Superdévoluy and La Joue du Loup, in the stunning mineral landscapes of the limestone Dévoluy massif.

O MONTGENÈVRE

On the Italian border. Its 8 tracks ranging from 2,450 to 1,860 m have made this park a benchmark. You'll find a wash and repair station there too.

Q LES ORRES

A fun, sporty and accessible playground at altitudes of 1,600 m to 2,600 m, sure to satisfy every MTB fan. The "Moniteur Cycliste Français" school provides training while the new "Pôle Sport Innovation" centre allows you to train virtually on an ultra-black slope at maximum speed.

PRA LOUP

The Clappe telemix serves 7 slopes of all levels, with a total of 18 km downhill runs and an elevation gain of 500 m. Beginners will enjoy the fun, free space, accessible via the Clapiers ski mat.

PUY SAINT VINCENT


The base camp of world champion Jordan Sarrou. Gazing out over the Barre des Écrins, this bike park featuring a family trail welcoming kids aged 5 years upwards and mini MTB bike park, is a must for your first family rides.

Q VARS

In 2023, Vars launched around 55 km of new electric mountain bike trails for cross-country enthusiasts including free charging stations, plus a new Downhill track, making a total of 125 km routes for all disciplines.

SEIGNUS VAL D'ALLOS

The Enduro pioneer and organizer of the Tribe 10 000, Val d'Allos offers mythical singletracks starting out at an altitude of 2,371 metres, crowned with dazzling panoramic views over Grande Séolane and Le Pelat at 3,051 m.



STARRY, STARRY NIGHTS

Revel in a festival of constellations and reconnect with the infinite beauty of the universe - the nightly show in the Southern Alps is worthy of an Academy Award! And the biggest stars of the astronomy world have been admiring it through their telescopes since the 19th century... The Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur region is a forerunner in the fight against light pollution and the Southern Alps boasts one of France's six International Dark Sky Reserves, along with seven temples of astronomy.



THE HIGHEST OBSERVATOIRE DE SAINT-VÉRAN PAUL FELENBOK

SAINT-VÉRAN, QUEYRAS

How about spending a night at an altitude of almost 3,000 metres, in an awe-inspiring face-to-face with the galaxies? You can have fun trying to spot the Saint-Véran asteroid discovered here too, and the views of Mont Viso at sunrise are simply breathtaking. What's more, France's highest observatory boasts 150 clear nights a year...

How to get there: 3 to 5-hour walk from Saint-Véran with a 900-metre altitude difference, in both summer and winter.

Price: €95/person – Not recommended for children under 14 years in winter (December to May).

THE MOST ICONIC OBSERVATOIRE BARCELONNETTE-MERCANTOUR

BARCEL ONNETTE

This brand new Observatory invites visitors on a voyage back in time to the pioneering spirit of astronomers in the 1920s. The Father Josset telescope was built in 1929 for a British billionaire, and subsequently purchased by a missionary in China. A genuine jewel, open to the public, it is Europe's largest amateur telescope. The observatory also offers an educational trail dedicated to nocturnal fauna and biodiversity.

It is the first French "Station de Nuit" (Night Station) – a distinction recognizing quality amenities and educational value awarded by the French Astronomy Association – located in an International Dark Sky Reserve.

THE MOST FUTURISTIC NOEMA SUR LE PLATEAU DE BURE (2,552 m)

♀ DÉVOLUY

A radio astronomy hub: twelve 15-metre diameter antennas on Bure Plateau, above Super Devoluy, allow enthusiasts to observe the birth of stars and galaxies. The antennas all point towards the same star or galaxy, simulating a giant radio telescope measuring 1.7 km in diameter.

How to get there: 4 hour climb approx. Tour of the maintenance hall, control room, computing centre and living quarters (please book in advance).

THE MOST WIDE-REACHING OBSERVATOIRE DES BARONNIES PROVENÇALES O MOYDANS

Welcoming amateur enthusiasts and professional astronomers alike, this observatory invites visitors to admire various extraordinary instruments operated by an astrophysicist (820 mm telescope, 1,140 mm Dobson).

On-site accommodation available in converted sheepfolds – aptly named Mars, Jupiter and Neptune - with views over Risou mountain. Observation session postponed free of charge in the event of cloudy weather.



SERRES - BARONNIES PROVENÇALES REGIONAL NATURE RESERVE

The only well-preserved mill of its kind still standing in Buëch valley, the Moulin du Paroy - a Gîtes de France "4 ears of corn" establishment - offers two quest rooms and a self-catering gite for six people. Anja Mignard and her husband and beekeeper François have created a little museum documenting the mill's uses over the centuries, including cloth fulling, walnut oil extraction and spelt grinding. Jean Giono used to stop over here on his way from Trièves to Manosque. The rooms overlook the Aiguebelle torrent, which joins the river Buëch further on, and the Sigottier cliffs coveted by rock climbers. The nearby Bâtie-Monsaléon airfield is a benchmark for free flight enthusiasts. Honey and propolis sold on site.

BARCELONNETTE

Clothilde Chapuis, a trained cook who has worked at palaces in both Switzerland and France, defines herself as a pure product of the French hotel industry. 

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REFUGE DU PAVÉ

Q ECRINS NATIONAL PARK

REFURBISHED. Nestling inside a cirque glacier between Roche Méane and Pic Gaspard, above Lac du Pavé, this refuge perched at an altitude of 2,858 metres has just enjoyed a makeover.

Benefiting from a keeper for the first time in summer 2025, it offers access to the secretive Romanche valley, as well as Pointe des Aigles and Pic des Cavales. Seasoned hikers can access the refuge from the Pied du Col car park in Villar d'Arène, in about 4 hours. The keeper, Pauline Muller, has many a tale to tell, from the refuge's eventful history to the recent discovery of two never-before seen microscopic algae in Lac du Pavé. The Refuge du Pavé is one of 7 refuges in Écrins National Park bearing the "Esprit Parc National" quality label.

Keeper on site from June 15th to September 14th, 2025, half board full rate €65, bookings on the FFCAM website (French Federation of Alpine and Mountain Clubs).

REFUGE DU CLOT DES VACHES

♥ MONÊTIER-LES-BAINS SERRE-CHEVALIER ECRINS NATIONAL PARK

NEW. Perched at an altitude of 2,250 metres in the sumptuous Cerces massif, Le Clôt des Vaches is Serre Chevalier valley's very first mountain refuge. Fitted with a larch wood facade, dry toilets and solar panels, it is a proud holder of the "Mediterranean Sustainable Building" label. Open 10 months out of 12 with a keeper, it can accommodate up to 30 people in small dormitories each sleeping 5 to 7. An easy educational trail dotted with 13 information panels accompanies walkers from the Pont de l'Alp car park (served by Briançon-Grenoble buses) up to the refuge in Le Lauzet, at an altitude of 1,709 metres. The views over the Écrins massif are breathtaking: aficionados can enjoy a foretaste thanks to the upcoming webcam.

QUEYRAS REGIONAL NATURE RESERVE

A CHEF'S REFUGE! After a stint alongside three-star chef Glenn Viel, Victor Castelli set up home at the Grand Rochebrune refuge, perched at an altitude of 1,840 metres in the hamlet of Souliers in Château Ville-Vieille, in the heart of the Queyras Regional Nature Reserve.

This charming wooden gite, topped with a large, south-facing terrace, enjoys splendid views over La Font Sancte and l'Aiguille de Chambeyron. Victor and his partner Alix concoct simple yet flavourful and surprising fare such as a Queyras Blue Cheese Espuma with notes of toasted walnuts and a traditional blueberry tart with a twist...

THE BIGGEST REFUGE DU GLACIER BLANC

Poised at an altitude of 2,542 metres, the Refuge du Glacier Blanc features 140 beds nestled in its stone walls. It is the largest of the 130 refuges managed by the FFCAM (French Federation of Alpine and Mountain Clubs) and one of the most popular, so book early! The refuge offers a perfect vantage point for observing the Écrins massif's largest glacier, the Glacier Blanc. Today, it takes almost an hour to climb to the ice front, once so close. The hike is well worth your while - the route up to this majestic high mountain landmark inspires admiration and respect, and the view over Le Pelvoux is breathtaking.

The Glacier Blanc is one of five French glaciers currently monitored for glacial retreat as part of a campaign by the IPCC (Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change).














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
