The Southern Alps promises a unique marriage of majestic mountains and scintillating sea. With summits soaring to over 4,000 metres and virgin valleys, it invites visitors to explore no less than 62 ski areas and village resorts, where each new day unveils winter under dazzling azure skies.

France's second-largest ski area, the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur region boasts 2,500 km of alpine slopes and 1,200 km of Nordic trails, forming an exceptional playground for skiers, hikers, climbers and trail runners alike against a stunning and beautifully preserved natural backdrop.

Set at the crossroads of Provence and the Côte d'Azur, the Southern Alps is a gem of culture and traditions too. Mountain lifestyle is everywhere here, cultivated by friendly inhabitants, all proud ambassadors of this authentic territory.

Fully aware of the climate emergency, the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur Regional Council voted Europe's first "100% green" budget and launched the "Pure Alpes" tagline, embodying their commitment to preserving the continent's purest air.


The Southern Alps is far more than a simple destination; it is a promise of escape in every season.

"Since 2017, under the impetus of Renaud Muselier, the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur Regional Council has chosen a clear path: to make the ecological transition a driving force for development rather than restriction. But their most powerful legacy will not be material. It will be a legacy of common sense."

Public transport: a revolution serving inhabitants and the Games alike

The Winter Olympics are accelerating the "rail revolution". Since 2016, rail travel in Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur has already doubled and the objective is clear: 1.5 million passengers in 2030.

Public transport is enjoying an overhaul thanks to the Games:

• The Provence Côte d'Azur Ligne Nouvelle (New Line), featuring an airport station unique in Europe, is scheduled for delivery in 2029, in time to welcome the Olympic Games in Nice.

- Modernisation of the Chemins de Fer de Provence, including a maintenance site and eight new hybrid trains.
- Salvaging of the Nice-Breil-Tende line, regeneration of the Côte Bleue service, and four Metropolitan Regional Express Service projects in Marseille, Avignon, Toulon and Nice.
- Modernisation of the Marseille-Briançon line, connecting the mountains to Marseille in 3 hours 40 minutes.

The upcoming Winter Games will be celebrated throughout the Southern Alps, not just at a few Olympic sites! This winter, "La Tournée des Neiges" will be coming to our ski resorts: a popular, sporty and cultural event designed to embark the entire population on the Olympic and Paralympic adventure.

Inspiring champions prepping for the podium!

From February 6th to 22nd, the Milano Cortina 2026 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games will be bringing the elite of the alpine skiing world together in neighbouring Italy. And you'll find plenty of Southern Alpine champions among them!

Terence TCHIKNAVORIAN Ski Cross

Milan Cortina: Terence Tchiknavorian's third Winter Games. This athlete from Avignon will be representing Le Sauze/ Barcelonnette and Ubaye Valley in the ski cross competition. Since his first World Cup victory in 2021, he has conquered the podium no less than 9 times. Terence also enjoys surfing the waves of Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur's Mediterranean shores and top hotspots.





Melvin TCHIKNAVORIAN Ski Cross

"Ski cross is a blend of alpine skiing techniques, freeride commitment and the lightness of freestyle skiing." Skiing is a way of life in the Tchiknavorian family. Melvin, born in Marseille, chose to specialize in ski cross and continues to train at Le Sauze ski club. At 28 years of age, this police officer navigates bumps and banked turns with ease and won the silver medal at the World Championships mixed event in March 2025 in Saint-Moritz.

Nils ALLÈGRE

Super G

Born and bred in Saint-Chaffrey, one of the departure points for Serre Chevalier's ski slopes, Nils trained at Luc Alphand's prestigious ski club. This high-level athlete, a sergeant in the French Defence and Gendarmerie (SHND-G) corps, is also the patron of the High Mountain Gendarmerie Platoon (PGHM) in Briançon. France's Super-G champion, he swept up his first World Cup victory in 2024 in Garmisch, Germany. His favourite hobby? Fishing!





Julia PEREIRA DE SOUSA

Snowboard

A 2018 snowboard silver medallist at the age of 16 in 2018 - making her the youngest French Winter Olympics medal winner -, this athlete from the Île-de-France area has made Isola 2000 her second home. She came fifth in Beijing in 2022 after two cruciate ligament tears, then returned to the highest level, winning two medals at the 2025 World Championships: bronze in the individual event and gold in the team event.

Camille CERUTTI

Downhill-Super G

This young woman from Marseille discovered skiing in Risoul. At just 4 years of age, she joined the local sports club and later, the Alpes-Provence regional committee. Selected for the Youth Olympic Games in Lillehammer in 2016, she competed in both the giant slalom and speed events. In 2021, she was crowned France's Super-G champion, but suffered injuries during the downhill event at the Beijing Olympic Games.

Downhill-Super G



Chiara attended school in the Briançon area up to age 15. A member of the Serre Chevalier ski club, she joined the French Alpine Ski Team in 2017. After back surgery in March 2025, she is set to be in top form for the Slalom event at the Milan Cortina Olympic Games.





Arthur BAUCHET

Para Alpine Skiing

Already a legend! At almost 26 years of age, Arthur Bauchet from Saint-Tropez has racked up some impressive achievements that go beyond skiing: four-times
Paralympic silver medallist in Pyeongchang in 2018 and triple Paralympic champion (downhill, Super-Combined and slalom) in Beijing in 2022, he is also the winner of the overall para-cycling World Cup title in Italy in 2025.





NIIS ALPHAND

Super G

Born in 1996, Nils is the son of Luc Alphand, winner of the 1997 World Cup and brother of Estelle Alphand and Sam Alphand, who regularly feature on the European Cup podiums. Nils Alphand made a name for himself when he won the Super-G junior world championship title in 2017. Injured - like his brother - last winter, he is also determined to make the Alphand name shine again at the Olympic Games.



2030 Winter Olympics the Southern Alpes in freestyle mode!

Part of the exciting 2030 Olympic Games line-up, freestyle skiing was born in the Southern Alps. You'll find plenty of adapted snow parks and boardercross courses here, together with a wealth of renowned professionals including many local athletes competing in the World Cup and Olympic Games, and world-class instructors. Freestyle skiing encompasses six ever-evolving disciplines: moguls, aerials, ski cross, slopestyle, halfpipe and big air. It embodies a new vision of skiing - one that is more playful and acrobatic, and a genuine philosophy among aficionados.

Montgenèvre will be hosting the 2030 halfpipe Olympic competition, where riders perform a series of rotations, grabs and switch tricks inside a half-pipe. Currently under construction, the halfpipe is set to become a permanent fixture. Serre Chevalier will be hosting the aerials, moguls, and big air events.



Saint-Dalmas-le-Selvage

Two-thirds of Saint-Dalmas-le-Salvage - the highest village in the Alpes-Maritimes area - lie on the protected expanses of Mercantour National Park. Here, cross-country skiers enjoy warming up on a 3-kilometre loop, while ski tourers make a beeline for Col de la Braïssa or Sestrières plateau. The 50 km of snowshoeing trails also lead to Bousieyas, the highest hamlet in the Alpes-Maritimes (1,960 metres). In Provencal dialect, its name "bousihar" means "to blow a gale".

Izoard

The Nordic ski areas of Cervières and Arvieux en Queyras wind their way around the personality-packed Col d'Izoard of Tour de France fame, where nature goes hand in hand with every sporting challenge and vast larch forests promise an invigorating breath of fresh air. If you love the wide-open spaces of the Queyras and Briançonnais areas, be sure to explore the cross-country ski trails - the trail connecting le Laus to the Col d'Izoard pass is a must.

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La Draye

Perched on the heights of Serre-Ponçon, the Nordic ski area of La Draye, home to "Bout du Mélèze" forest, boasts breathtaking views over Durance Valley and Serre-Ponçon lake. You won't find any ski passes here, but rather a tree trunk at the start of the slopes where you can leave however much you want. The money collected is used to pay for the vintage snow groomer's petrol and upkeep. Thanks to the combined efforts of the managers of Gîte de la Draye, a musher and local lads and gals, this delightful ski area, lying at an altitude of 1,500 metres on the heights of Boscodon forest, is back on track.

Clarée Valley

Névache and Val-des-Prés on the banks of the river Clarée are musts for mountain lovers seeking simplicity combined with beautiful and preserved natural landscapes. The valley is home to a host of welcoming hotels, guest houses and restaurants, together with a biathlon shooting range, two downhill ski slopes and numerous cross-country ski trails such as Les Planchettes and La Forestière, upgraded for the 2025-2026 winter season.

A route leads to the Col de l'Échelle pass, the gateway to an even more secluded valley: Vallée Streta, a Franco-Italian curiosity home to a handful of chalets and two mountain refuges, I Re Magi and Terzo Alpini, where you'll find Italy both in the atmosphere and on the menu. The site can only be reached with snowshoes and a guide in winter.

Colmars-Ratery 1700

Located at altitudes of 1685 to 1800, metres, the Ratery 1700 Nordic ski area promises an unrivalled change of scenery just a stone's throw from the beating heart of Mercantour National Park. Its magnificent north-facing larch forest guarantees excellent snow cover on the twenty or so groomed trails.

The four-season laser biathlon stadium, safe toboggan run and snowshoeing trails are a family favourite. You'll find quality local cuisine at the "Chalet de Ratery", topped with novel accommodation in a mountain yurt. Equipment rental available. The ski area is easy to reach from Colmars-les-Alpes (6 km), recently awarded the "Plus Beaux Villages de France" (Most Beautiful French Villages) label, as well as Val d'Allos (12 km).

The Southern Alps' 62 ski resorts are all packed with personality and high-performance amenities that blend in beautifully with the magnificent local heritage. Various exceptional ski areas such as Serre Chevalier - Briançon, Montgenèvre, Pra Loup, Val d'Allos, Vars, Risoul and Auron, pan out around medieval villages. The hearts of champions often beat in these lively, time-old hamlets, inhabited year-round, adding to their inimitable charm.

Pioneering

Orcières Merlette 1850, Champsaur-Valgaudemar Valley

The slopes of Orcières-Merlette fan out to the south, between the two highest summits: Drouvet (2,655 m) and Gnourou (2,725 m). The recently re-groomed Vallons blue slope offers magical views over Champsaur Valley. Terraces adorned with animal sculptures offer resting places for hikers on the way up to Rocherousse plateau, where you'll find a great choice of activities including dog sledding, ski tubing in the Winter Parc, a fun zone and the departure point for a cross-country adventure.

The redesigned snow front now offers easier access for beginners thanks to a covered magic carpet lift. The new Muande chairlift provides easy access to the Camille Ricou slope, hosting prestigious events every winter. Beautifully refurbished and sporting the "Qualité Confort Hébergement" (Quality Comfort Accommodation) label, the apartments feature an open-plan design. Three kilometres away, the Orcières leisure centre unveils a different winter pace, with Nordic skiing and dog sledding for children along the river Drac. Back in the day, Orcières introduced the first children's snow club and first combined chair and gondola lift. Sixty years on, the resort continues to innovate tirelessly.

This year, the resort of Orcières Merlette 1850 will host the final of the European Snowboard Cup, a must-see event on the international circuit. Athletes will come here to earn their final points before the world finals, in a friendly sporting atmosphere in the heart of the Southern Alps.

A Charming Duo

Superdévoluy & la Joue du Loup, Massif du Dévoluy

Dévoluy, a U-shaped mountain range culminating at the summit of mount Obiou, boasts two ski resorts with very different styles, although both are imbued with the same southern alpine charm. Le Bois d'Aurouze, nicknamed the "Cruise Liner of the Snow," is an iconic building in Superdévoluy, classified as "Remarkable Contemporary Architecture", while La Joue du Loup is lined with charming wooden chalets. Both resorts share one hundred kilometres of alpine slopes, a fun and innovative snow park, and cross-country skiing area spanning nearly 40 kilometres offering a vast panel of activities. The unique off-piste options include a via souterrata (underground climbing route), Roll My Ball course, four-seasons sledding and horse-drawn carriage rides. The O'dycéa spa pampers guests with whirlpool baths and magical panoramic vistas over the iconic Pic de Bure...



On Top of the World **Serre Chevalier**

Serre Chevalier's 250 kilometres of pistes make it one of France's largest ski areas, perfect for hosting the 2030 Olympic moguls and freestyle events! Most of the slopes stretch up to altitudes of over 2,000 metres on the heights of Guisane Valley, between Briançon and Col du Lautaret, promising mesmerizing views for skiers of all levels. Serre Chevalier is also extremely handy to reach, with easy access from Briançon via the Prorel gondola crossing the town's UNESCO World Heritage fortifications, as well as all the villages dotted around the valley.

The Pontillas gondola lift on the snow front of La Salle-les-Alpes whisks novices up to the new beginner's area on Méa plateau.

A fun and stylish resort, Serre Chevalier is also pioneering sustainable development and exploring every avenue to reduce its environmental impact. It is currently the first ski resort to produce a third of its own energy requirements using a combination of micro turbines, hydroelectricity and solar power.

RÉSIDENCE-CLUB SERRA NEVA**** | La Salle-les-Alpes



Located next to the Pontillas gondola, one of the main departure points for the Serre Chevalier ski lifts, the 4-star Serra Neva MMV Club-Residence features 164 apartments with hotel services for 2 to 8 guests. An electric shuttle takes you to the door in under 5 minutes. The lounge-bar, complete with a fireplace and large terrace, is instilled with a delightful atmosphere. The heated outdoor pool overlooks the surrounding mountains, while the spa offers a sauna, steam room and varied treatment menu (including for children aged 6 years and over), as well as yoga and sophrology classes.

A good entertainment line-up and Kids Club for children aged 4 to 17 years promise a lively stay. A breakfast service is available, although you won't find a restaurant on site. The building itself is eco-certified "Very High Performance", with a boiler room powered with wood pellets and 300 m² of solar panels. The partial green roof houses nesting boxes for swallows and bats. Ski shop available.

Valley of Marvels Castérino Roya Valley

Situated in Haute-Roya, in the town of Tende, Casterino is a beautifully-preserved paradise at the foot of Mercantour National Park. Tucked at an altitude of 1,550 metres on the French border, the hamlet is surrounded by stunning peaks including the mythical Mont Bégo, revered by Neolithic shepherds... This haven of peace is just 11/2 hours from the hustle and bustle of Nice by car. In summer, Castérino is the starting point for the aptly-named Vallée des Merveilles and its prehistoric rock paintings, while popular winter activities include ski touring, ascending the peaks of Mercantour National Park to enjoy uninterrupted views over the Med, or snowshoeing up to the Refuge des Merveilles anchored in a cirque of frozen lakes.
